concerning the Title of Duke of Burgundy, in which he has the more reason to perswade himself that they will be fucceisful, feeing that he cannot but believe, that the most Christian King has been ill informed of the Right he has been told to have, to this new pretention, make founded upon the Treaty of Nimeguen, and the Ceffion thereby flipulated of the Franche-Comte; for, that that County never has had any thing of common with the Dutchy of Burgundy, and the King of Spain's Powers for the Treaty of Nimeguen, the Ratification of the Peace, and those for his Marriage, bore the Title of Duke of Burgundy, notwithstanding ; the French made any exception to it; and that the States may be better informed in this matter; the faid Envoye adds to the faid Memorial, the Articles of feveral Treaties between the two Crowns, from the time of the Emperor Charles the V. that concerns the faid Dutchy of Burgundy.

Paris, July 13. This day the King parted from St. Germains with the Queen, the Dauphinefs, and the other Ladies of the Court, for Flanders. Its faid the Ladies will go no farther than Cambray. There feems to be but little appearance as yet, of accomoclating the differences with the Court of Rome; and we are told, that the King has ordered, that all Couriers that come from thence, shall be flopt at Lyons. It is faid, that the King has prolonged the term, which was fett the Spaniards, to declare themfelves in, concerning the Title of Duke of Burgundy, for a month or fix weeks.

Kinfale, June 22. The Garland Frigat, and the Kuby are now in this Harbor, being to take on board fome Companies of the Earl of Dumbartons Regiment, and to carry them to Tangier; the reft of the Frigats appointed for that fervice, are hourly expected. This morning failed the Conflant Warwick to cruife.

Edenburg, June 30. About three weeks fince Mr. Donald Cargile, a Preacher in the Field Conventicles, and Mr. Hall (who were both actually in the late Rebellion) being taken at Queensferry, there was found in their Portmantles, among other Treafonable and Seditious Papers, the draught of a new Covenant, by which they fwear, To advance the Kingdom of Christ, and the true Reformed Religion ; to extirpate Kingly Government and Prelacy, ec, which being brought before the Council, while their Lordships were fearching into this Matter, a vet more execrable Paper was fent to them by General Dalkee, being a Declaration, which was the 22 of this month Published and Affixed, af--ter a folemn Procession, and Singing of Plalms, by 21 perfons on the Crofs at Sanchar, wherein they Declare, That for themselves, and all that will adhere to them, as the Representatives of the True Prefbyterian Church, and Covenanted Nation of Scotland, They do difown Charles Stewart, who has been Reigning, or rather Tyraniziug, on the Throne of Brittaine thele years palt, as baving any Right or Title to, or Interest in the Crown of Scotland, or Govern-ment, as forfeited several years since, by His Per-jury, and breach of Covenant with God and his Chursh, and Ulurpation of Hin Crown, and Royal Prerogatives therein, &c. The General has likewife informed the Council, that he has difcovered, that there is a Party of these Rebels, to the number of about 70 in Arms, and that he has fent out feveral Pasties in fearch of them, in order to the Apprehending and bringing them to condign punifhment,

Plymouth, July 4. On Friday last arrived in this Port, the Charles Galley, and the Swan Frigat from. the Streights; on board the First. Was the Earl of chiquin; late Governor of Tangier. This morning arrived another of the Kings Ships, being Convoy to several Merchant Ships, bound home from Smirna, and other places, which are pass by to the Eastward.
