WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously plcaled, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Poundes of Five Founds for every Able Seaman, and Two Poundes Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-rected to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years who fhould on or before the Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-played on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majelty was also gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on 'or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward bath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant "enable His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of

THEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Eleventh Day of December laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safetv of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to com-mence from the Date of this Order, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Tur-pentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or thip or lade any of the Ar-ticles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permillion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy

** Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammuni-" tion, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majeity's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majelty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiflioners of His Majelty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's. Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies' and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certilicates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

An Act to remove Doubts arising from the Conftruction of an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for permitting certain Goods imported from the East Indies to be warehoused, and for repealing the Duties now payable thereon, and granting other Duties in lieu thereof.

An Act to allow for Nine Months after the paffing of the A& the Ufe of Sugar in the brewing of Beer.

An Act to revive and continue until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and one, such Part of an Act made in the prefent Seffion of Parliament for reducing the Duties upon Spirits diftilled from Melaffes or Sugar or any Mixture therewith, and for other Purposes as relates to the Duties on Wort or Wash brewed or made from Melaffes or Sugar.

An Act for further continuing and amending an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament for enabling His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty.

An Act for permitting the free Importation of. Linfeed Cakes and Rape Cakes in Neutral Ships.

An Act to repeal fo much of an Act passed in the Second Year of King James the First as prohibits the Ufe of Horfe Hides in making Boots and Shoes, and for better preventing the damaging of Raw Hides and Skins in the flaying thereof.

An A& for repealing Part of the Duties and Drawbacks of Cuftoms on Kid Skins imported, and the Exemption of imported Kid Skins from Excile Duty on being dreffed in Great Britain.

An A& to leffen the Duties on Wine and Spirits the Produce of the British Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and to empower the Importers to land the fame before Payment of the Duties of Excife, and to lodge the fame in Warehoufes, and to allow the fame to be fhipped, free of Duty, as Stores to be confumed on board Merchants' Ships on their Voyages.

An Act for extending the Royalty of the City of Glafgow over certain adjacent Lands; for paving, lighting, and cleanfing the Streets; for regulating the Police, and appointing Officers and Watchmen; for dividing the City into Wards, and appointing Commissioners, and for raising Funds, and giving certain Powers to the Magistrates and Council, and Town, and Dean of Guild Courts, for the above and other Purpofes.

An AA to explain, amend, and render more effectual Two Acts made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of King George the Second, and in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty for draining and preferving certain Fen Lands and Low Grounds in the Ifle of Ely and County of Cambridge between the Cam, otherwife Grant, Oufe, and Mildenhall Rivers, and bounded on the South-Ealt by the Hard Lands of Isleham, Fordham, Soham, and Wicken, and for empower-ing the Governor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty of the Company of Confervators of the Great Level of the Fens called Bedford Level, to fell certain Lands within the faid Limits commonly called Invefted Lands, and for laying certain Rates on Veffels navigated upon the faid Rivers towards fupporting the Banks thereof.

SIR, Ville de Paris, off Ushant. Defire you will communicate to the Lords Com-Delire you will communicate to an influence of the Admiralty the inclosed Report from Rear-Admiral Sir John Borlafe Warren, of a well-concerted Enterprize to deflroy that Part of the Enemy's Convoy that had escaped from Saint Croix to Quimper, which only failed of its well

meditated Succels by the Ships retiring up the River ; and I cannot too much praife the Conduct of it. ST. VINCENT. I am,

Renown; at Sea, June 24, 1800. MY LORD, I Take the Liberty of informing your Lordship, that having observed a small Squadron of the Enemy's Vessels at the Mouth of Quimper River, I anchored on the 22d, at Night, off the Glenans, and directed a Detachment of Marines, together with Three Boats manned and armed from the different Ships* under my Orders, to rendezvous on board the Fifgard, to follow the Commands of Captain Martin, and to endeavour to take or deftroy the above Veffels : and I beg Leave to refer you to the inclosed Letter from Captain Martin for the Transactions on this Service.

Fifgard, at Sea, June 23, 1800. SIR, I Beg to inform you that the Boats of the Squa-dron and Marines employed under my Direction, in attacking the Veffels of War and Convoy of the Enemy in Quimper River, arrived off its Entrance at Daylight this Morning, and, in order to protect the Boats in the Execution of this Service, the Marines were landed in Two Divisions, the one on the Right Bank of the River under Lieutenant Burke, of the Renown, and the other on the Left under Lieutenant Gerrard, of this Ship.

Lieutenant Yarker commanded the Boats, and was going with great Expedition and good Order to the Attack, but finding the Enemy had removed to an inacceffible Diffance up the River, he immediately landed, ftormed, and blew up a Battery with feveral Twenty-four-Pounders.

The other Detachment also took and blew up Two ftrong Works.

It gives me great Pleafure to fay this Affair terminated without any Lofs on our Part; and the Preparation made by the Enemy in Confequence of my reconnoitring their Position yesterday Morning gives the most fatisfactory Testimony in Favour of the Spirit and Conduct of the Officers and Men, who, in lefs than Half an Hour gained complete Poffeffion of both Sides of the River to a confider-able Extent, and if the Veffels fpecified in the Margin + had not moved upwards, they would certainly have fallen into our Hands.

MY LORD, Have the Honor to inform your Lordhip, that I this Day continued I all I this Day captured Le Vengeur, a French Brig Privateer carrying Six long Four-Pounders and Ten Eighteen-Pound Carronades, with a Hundred Men : Two Days from Bourdeaux, intending to cruize on the Coast of Brazil. She failed in Company with Three Letters of Marque, a Ship, a Brig, and a Schooner bound to Guadaloupe, and captured Yellerday the Snake Lugger Privateer of Jerley.
