**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for repealing the Duties of Excise on Distilleries in Scotland, and on the Exportation of British made Spirits from England to Scotland, and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof; and for altering, amending, and continuing certain Acts of Parliament for the Regulation of Distilleries in Scotland.

An Act to amend several Laws relating to the Duties on stamped Vellum, Parchment, and Paper.

An Act for extending the Powers of the Commissioners named in an Act made in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for appointing Commissioners to put in execution an Act of this Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for continuing and granting to His Majesty a Duty on Pensions, Offices, and Personal Estates in England and Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed; and certain Duties on Sugar, Malt, Tobacco, and Snuff, for the Service of the Year One thousand eight hundred, together with those named in Two former Acts for appointing Commissioners of the Land Tax, for indemnifying such Persons, named in the said Act, as have acted as Commissioners of the Land Tax, and for amending certain Acts done by them.

An Act for repealing the Duties on Perfumery, and on Licences for vending the same.

An Act to exempt from Duty Waste Paper imported into this Kingdom for the Purpose of being re-manufactured, except the Duty imposed by an Act of the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of

His present Majesty for the better Protection of the Trade of this Kingdom, and for granting new and additional Duties of Customs on Goods imported and exported.

An Act for making Allowances, in certain Cases, to Subaltern Officers of the Militia in Time of Peace.

An Act for indemnifying Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, and Persons acting as such, in the West-India Islands, who have permitted the Importation and Exportation of Goods and Commodities in Foreign Bottoms.

An Act to discharge from a disputed and dormant Claim of the Public several Estates belonging to the Right Honorable William Carr Earl of Erroll, Lord High Constable of Scotland.

An Act for the Security of Collieries and Mines, and for the better Regulation of Colliers and Miners.

An Act to authorize Bakers and other Persons to sell Bread to His Majesty's Forces on their March which shall not have been baked Twenty-four Hours, and to indemnify all Persons by whom such Bread may have been sold.

An Act for amending several Acts for regulating the Price and Assize of Bread.

An Act to explain, amend, and render more effectual an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of King James the First, intituled, An Act for the recovering of Small Debts, and for the relieving of Poor Debtors in London, and an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, to explain and amend the above-mentioned Act; and likewise to extend the Powers of the Court of Requests in the City of London, in and by the said Two several Acts continued and established.

An Act for taking down and rebuilding, upon a more enlarged Scale, the Chapel of Saint Mary, in the Town of Caernarvon.

An Act for establishing a new Church or Chapel lately erected on the South Side of Hunter-Street, within the Town and Parish of Liverpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for the Appointment and Regulation of Pilots and Hoblers for the conducting of Ships and Vessels into and out of the Port or Harbour and River of Neath, in the County of Glamorgan, for
