A T the Court at St. James's, the 29th of July 1800,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twelfth of February laft, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into or made useful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of August next : and whereas it is expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of his Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Twelfth Day of August next, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into or made useful as a Naval Store; or ship or lade any of the Articles abovementioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permifion being fult had and obtained from His Majelty or his Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majefty's Reign, Chap. 2. ; and also by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, Chap. 34, any Thing contained in His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth Day of June last to the contrary notwithstanding : and the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord

Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain. Steph. Cottrell.

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twentyfecond Year of His late Majefty King Charles the Second, intituled " An Additional Act for the rebuilding of the City of London, uniting the " Parishes, and rebuilding of the Cathedral and Pa-"rochial Churches within the faid City," taking Notice that great Exactions had been, and were exercifed by Wharfingers and others employed about the Wharfage and Cranage of Goods landed or shipped off at or from the faid City of London; for Remedy thereof it was enacted, that luch Rates and no other fhould from Time to Time be taken for Wharfage and Cranage, as well of Timber and other Materials for building, as of Coals and other Goods and Merchandizes, as by His faid Majefty, with the Advice of His Frivy Council, fhould for that Purpofe be affeffed and allowed to be taken, a Table of which Rates should be hanged up at every of the faid Wharfs respectively; and if any Wharfinger or other should exact or demand, or directly or indirectly take or receive for Wharfage or Cranage, or by Colour thereof more than according to the Rates which should be fo affested, or should refuse to suffer any Goods or Merchandize to be landed or fhipped at, off, or from any Wharf or Wharfs within the faid City or the Liberties thereof at the Rates aforefaid, fuch Offender fhould forfeit for every fuch Offence the Sum of Ten Pounds to the Party or Parties thereby grieved, to be recovered with full Cofts of Suit, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of His Majefty's Courts of Record at Weftminfter of within the faid City of London, as the Caufe. fhould arife, wherein no Effoin, Protection, of Wager of Law should be allowed, nor any more than one Imparlance.

And whereas, no Table of Rates has been yet affeffed or allowed for many Wharfs within the
