

XLIV. And it is hereby further ordered, That the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War, as likewise the Commanders of His Majesty's Forts and Garrisons lying near the Sea Coasts, and all Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Justice, shall be aiding and assisting to the said Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping such Ships as aforesaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, as well as in enforcing due Performance thereof.

XLV. And is hereby further ordered, That this Order, and the Regulations therein contained, shall take effect and be in force from the First Day of October next ensuing the Date hereof, until which Time the Orders and Regulations now subsisting touching Quarantine shall continue in force, but which subsisting Orders and Regulations, and the Authority of the same, shall from and after the said First Day of October wholly cease and determine.

XLVI. And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Wardeu of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

I Have this Instant received the enclosed Letters by His Majesty's Ship Unicorn, from Captain Keats of the Boadicea.

*MY LORD, Boadicea, at Sea, August 4, 1800.*

THE Figgard, which had been stationed conformable to your Lordship's Directions, rejoined the Squadron this Day with the Prizes and Recaptures as stated in Captain Martin's accompanying Letter.

*SIR, Figgard, at Sea, 3d August 1800.*

I Have to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command, has captured the following Vessels since the 20th of last Month:

St. John Baptiste, Spanish Lugger (burnt).

La Gironde, Sixteen Guns, One Hundred and Forty-one Men, French Privateer.

L'Alerte, Fourteen Guns, Eighty-four Men, French Privateer.

The Joseph, an English South Sea Ship, Prize to the Minerve French Privateer.

It will, I am sure, give you particular Satisfaction to find La Gironde one of the Number, as she has long been an active and successful Cruizer against the Commerce of our Country, and was now returning to Port with Fifty-three English Prisoners taken in the Vessels hereafter specified. L'Alerte is only Six Days from Bourdeaux, and was fitted purposely to cruize for the Homeward-bound West India Convoy.
