His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. IF any Perfon thall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Weltminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer' contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offeuder shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boar, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seftion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-jefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, | thereof.

prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Ma-jeity, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil, or Implement whatfover, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Patt or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof ; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Polleffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are abave-mentioned, in the cafe of Tools and Utenfils. uled in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

W Hereas it has been humbly represented to His Majefly that in the Night of Thurjday the 24th of July laft, or early in the Morning of Friday the 25th, the Cuftom Houfe at the Port of Milford, in the County of Pembroke, was felonioufly broken open by fome Perfon or Perfons, who, by Means of a Ladder which they cut Perfons, who, by Alteant of a Laader wonce very can down from the Roof of an adjacent Building, got in at the Window of the Comptrollar's Office, and forced open the Defes of the Collector and Comptroller with a Sawyer's Axe, and fiele thereout Cofb and a Number of Five Guinea Bills iffued from the Banks of Car-marthen and Haverfordweit, amounting together to the Sum of Three Hundred and Sixty-four Pounds and aparards, and One Bill drawn by William Pownal of Briftol, at One Edonth after Date, on Meffrs. Goobehere, Wigan, and Co. London, for the Sum of Thirty-fix Pounds, in Favor of George Hough, the Collector of the Cuftoms at the faid Port of Milford; His Majefly, for the better difcovering and bringing

to Juffice the Perfons concerned in this Felony and Robe bery, is hereby pleafed to promife His most gracious Par-don to any One of the faid Offenders who shall first discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any One or more of them may be apprehended and convisted thereof. PORTLAND.
