Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Hugh Sey. mour, Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels at the Leeward Iflands, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated Fort Royal Bay, Martinique, 15th Fune 1800.

SIR,

Have the Satisfaction to enclose to you, for the A Information of my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, a Letter which I have received from Captain Weltern, of His Majefty's Ship Tamer, acquainting me, that he had, on the 1ft Inftant, fallen in with and captured, after a Chace of Eight Hours, the French Privateer Ship General Maffena. MY LORD, Tamer; Barbadoes, June 3, 1800. Have the Honor to inform your Lordfhip, that on Sunday last, the 1st Instant, I fell in with and captured, after a Chace of Eight Hours, within Gun-Shot, (his Stern Chafes conftantly flying over the Tamer,) the French Privateer Ship General Massena, pierced for Eighteen Guns, besides a Bridle Port, but had only Sixteen on board, and One Hundred and Fifty Men ; his Guns, except Four Brafs Twelve-Pounders, with all his Boats, Spars, &c. he threw overboard during the Chace: fhe is Forty Days from Bourdeaux, and coming as a Cruifer amongst these Islands; he had captured the Adventure of Liverpool, laden with Coals, bound to De-marara, and burnt her; and Two Americans, one of which he burnt, and the other he fent to Guada-I am, &c. T. WESTERN. loupe.
