And, as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy, it is enacted by the Twentieth Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy in London to have such Half-Pay paid at or near to the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act;" Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 30th June 1800 will commence paying on the 8th Instant, and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
