The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS Information hath been received that an Epidemic Fever is now raging in the Town of Norfolk, in Virginia, and at Balti-more, in Maryland, within the United States of America; His Majefty deeming the faid Fever to be probably infectious, doth, by and with the Ad-vice of his Privy Council, deem it expedient to declare, and by this His Order doth declare, that the faid Fever is probably infectious within the Mean-ing of the Act palled in the Thirty-eighth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to "amend Two Acts made in the Twenty-fixth "Year of King George the Second, and the "Twenty-eighth Year of His prefent Majefty, " refpecting the Performance of Quarantine, &c." And doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that all And doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Mer-chandizes, which, fince the first Daý of this inftant November have arrived, or which shall hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the If the soft of the Ports of this Kingdom, of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Virginia or Maryland, (not having any Perfon or Perfons on board the fame actually ill of the faid Fever,) do perform a Quarantine of Fourteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prefcribed by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth of July laft, for Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and arriving with clean Bills of Health; and in cafe any of the Crew or Paffengers on board any fuch Ship or Veffel, which, fince the faid firft Day of November has arrived, or which hereafter fhall arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the faid Ports of Virginia or of Maryland, shall have died of the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage, the Clothes and all perfonal Effects which are fusceptible of Infection, worn by or be-longing to fuch Person, sitall be forthwith burned or funk in deep Water; but if fuch Clothes and Ef-

fects shall not be fo burned or destroyed, the faid Ship or Veffel, with the Whole of her Cargo and Crew, shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place except at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which the fame has arrived or shall arrive as aforefaid, and shall repair to Standgate Creek and there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere : And His Majelty is turther pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, and it is hereby ordered, that if it shall appear, upon the Arrival of any Ship or Vessel from any of the faid Ports of Virginia or of Maryland, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame are actually ill of the faid Fever, then fuch Ship or Veffel, and the Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, on board the fame, fhall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place except Standgate Creek, and fhall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place, and to proceed immediately to Standgate Creek in order to perform Quarantine, and shall there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere: And the Right Honorable the Lords ellewhere: And the Kight Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Com-miffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
