PROCLAMATION, Α

Containing His Majefly's Declaration, That it is expedient that the Lords and Commons of the prefent Parliament of Great Britain fould be the Members of the refpective Houfes of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the Part of Great Britain ; and commanding the faid Lords and Commons to give their Attendance accordingly.

HEREAS by the Fourth Article of the Articles of the Union of Great Britain and Ireland, as the fame are ratified and confirmed by Two Acts of Parliament, the one passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled An Act for the Union of Great Britain and Ireland, the other paffed in the Parliament of Ireland, alfo intituled An Act for the Union of Great Britain and Ire-land, to have Force and Effect from the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and one, it is provided, that if We, on or before the faid First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and one, on which Day the Union is to take place as aforefaid; should declare, under the Great Seal of Great Britain, that it is expedient that the Lords and Commons of the prefent Par-liament of Great Britain fhould be the Members of the refpective Houfes of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the Part of Great Britain ; then the faid Lords and Commons of the prefent Parliament of Great Britain should accordingly be the Members of the respective Houses of the First Parliament of the faid United Kingdom, on the Part of Great Britain: And whereas it is Our Intention to appoint Thurfday the Twenty fecond Day of January next enfuing for the affembling of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, by Proclamation under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom; We do judge it to be expedient, that the Lords and Commons of the pre-

Articles of Union, and to the Acts of Parliament ratifying and confirming the fame, hereby declare, under Our Great Seal of Great Britain, that it is expedient that the Lords and Commons of the prefent Parliament of Great Britain should be the Members of the refpective Houles of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the Part of Great Britain; and the Lords and Commons of the prefent Parliament of Great Britain are accordingly to be the Members of the respective Houses of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Bri-tain and Ireland, on the Part of Great Britain : And the faid Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, are hereby required and commanded to take Notice thereof, and to give their Attendance accordingly, at Wellminster, on the faid Twentyfecond Day of January next enfuing.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the Fifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred, in the Forty-first Year of Our Reign.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. THEREAS Information hath been received that an Epidemic Fever is now raging in the Town of Norfolk, in Virginia, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America; His Majefty deeming the faid Fever to be probably infectious, doth, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, deem it expedient to declare, and by this His Order doth declare, that the faid Fever is probably infectious within the Mean-ing of the Act paffed in the Thirty-eighth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An A& to " amend Two Acts made in the Twenty-fixth " Year of King George the Sccond, and the " Twenty-eighth Year of His prefent Majefty, " refpecting the Performance of Quarantine, &c." And deth order and it is berown undered the all fent Parliament of Great Britain should be the Members of the respective Houses of the First Parliament of the United Kingdom, on the Part of Great Britain : And We do, pursuant to the faid November have arrived, or which shall hereafter



arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Illes of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Virginia or Maryland, (not having any Perfon or Perfons on board the fame actually ill of the faid Fever,) do perform a Quarantine of Fourteen Days at the leveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules preferihed by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentyhinth of July laft, for Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Vellels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Well Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and arriving with clean Bills of Health; and in cafe any of the Crew or Paffengers on board any fuch Ship or Veffel, which, fince the faid first Day of November has arrived, or which hereafter flall arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the faid Ports of Virginia or of Maryland, fhall have died of the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage, the Clothes and all perioual Effects which are fulceptible of Infection, worn by or be-longing to fuch Perfon, shall be forthwith burned or funk in deep Water; but if fuch Clothes and Effects shall not be fo burned or destroyed, the faid Ship or Vessel, with the Whole of her Cargo and Crew, shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place except at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which the fame has arrived or thall arrive as aforefaid, and thall tepair to Standrate Creek and there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere : And His Majelty is further pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, and it is hereby ordered, that if it shall appear, upon the Arrival of any Ship or Vessel from any of the faid Ports of Virginia or of Maryland, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame are actually ill of the faid Fever, then fuch Ship or Vellel, and the Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchaudizes, on board the fame, shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place except Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place, and to proceed immediately to Standgate Creek in order to perform Quaran-tine, and shall there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Com-missioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General and the reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
