Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, during the Night of Friday the 14th Instant, a Blunderbuss loaded with Shot and Shigs was fired through a Window of the House of Thomas Sawyer Champnys, Esq; of Orchardleigh, in the County of Somerset, into the Room where one of the Servants was in Bed; and which Bed, through the Interposition of Providence, had, by Chance, that Morning been moved from its usual Place opposite the Window; and by which

Means only the Man escaped (the Gardener) being blown to Pieces, as Thirty-six Panes of Glass were broke with the Shot and Balls; as also a Bullet was fired into the Door of One of the Bailiffs of the said Mr. Champnys;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Felony, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually fired the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice of Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that several atrocious Acts of Felony have lately been committed in the Parish and Neighbourhood of Uppingham, in the County of Rutland, by killing and taking away the Sheep belonging to the Farmers and others of that Neighbourhood;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Felonies above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Persons who actually committed the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, by J. A. Palmer, of the said Parish of Uppingham.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that several outrageous and atrocious Acts have of late been committed in the Town and County of Haverfordwest, and its Neighbourhood, by burning Two Stacks of Hay, the Properties of John Higgon, Esq; and Doctor Edwardes, and maiming a Mare belonging to Doctor Nash; as also several inflammatory threatening Letters have been sent to various Inhabitants of the said Town;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Felonies above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them (except the Persons who actually committed the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered by the Inhabitants of the said Town, to any one who shall make Discovery of the Persons who set Fire to the said Hay-Stacks; and ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS to any one who shall make Discovery of the Persons concerned in maiming the said Mare, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, by the Mayor of the said Town.
