The KING's Moft Excellent Majelty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His W Majefty at this board that the Epidemic Fever which fome Time fince raged in the Town of Norfolk, in Virginia, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America, has totally ceafed; His Majefty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of his Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twelfth of November last upon all Ships, Perlons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, fince the First Day of the faid Month of November had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Virginia or of Maryland, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to difcharge their respective Ladings without unpack-ing, opening, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cale fuch Order of the Twelth of November last had not been made; any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithftanding: Provided fuch Ships and Veffels shall have failed from the faid Ports of Virginia or Maryland fubfequent to the Fourth Day of November laft, and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board have died or been fick with the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage — And the Right Ho-norable the Lords Committeners of His Majefly's Treafury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-Governor and the rell of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necellary Directions herein as to them may respec-tively appertain. Copy of a Letter from Vice Admiral Lutwidge, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels in the Downs, to Mr. Nepean, dated on board the Overyffel, December 20, 1800.

I Defire you will pleafe to lay before the Lords Commificences of the Admiralty the enclosed Letter from Lieutenant Wells, commanding His Majefty's Hired Cutter the Lord Duncau, giving me an Account of his having captured the French Cutter Privateer L'Eclair, commanded by Jacquiere Touffaint le Terrier, carrying Three Guns and Twenty Men, having been out Two Days from Cherbourg, without taking any Thing.

SIR, Downs, 20th December 1800. I Beg Leave to acquaint you of my having feen the Convoy fafe into St. Helen's agreeably to your Directions; and that on my Return; (Thurf-day the 18th Inflant,) being off Shoreham in a thick Fog, I fell in with and captured L'Eclair French Cutter Privateer, scommanded by Jacquiere Touffaint le Terrier, carrying Three Two-Pounders, small Arms, and Twenty Men; from Cherbourg Two Days, and had not taken any Thing.

Downing Street, December 23, 1800. DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, dated Head-Quarters, Muhldorf on the Inn, Thursday, 4th December 1800, has been received from William Wickham, Efq; by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majelty's Principal Secretary of State for the Foreign Department :

THE Army marched in the Night of Tuesday, and before Day break Yefterday Morning, towards Hohenlinden in Three Columns; the Centre along the Great Road to Munich, which paffes through Hohenlinden ; the Right and Left in the Woods on each Side of the Great Road.

The Corps of General Kienmayer, which was deftined to take the Enemy in Flank, marched from Dorfen in the Direction of Schwaben.

The Columns ought all to have arrived at their Defination a little before Day-break, or at the latest between Eight or Nine o'Clock; but from a heavy Fall of Snow and Sleet, which continued all Night and the greater Part of the Morning, the Centre Column only was at its Destination at Eight o'Clock, whill both the Left and Right were still confiderably behind; and the Left, under General Rifch had, befides, loft its Way, and marched to the Left towards Eberfberg, inftead of turning to the Right, in the Direction of Hohenlinden. In this State of Things it appears, that the Di-

vision of General Richepance pierced between the Left and the Centre about Nine o'Clock, got-upon the Great Road behind the Centre, and fell upon the Left Flank and Rear of that Column at the Time that it had formed in Front, and had just begun to attack the Enemy's Polition.

I have not yet been able to obtain any accurate Account of what paffed afterwards; but it feems that the Diforder foon became irretrievable, and that the Retreat towards the Heights of Ramfau was made with very heavy Lofs, particularly in Ar-tillery. Generals Spaniorchi and Löppert are Pritillery. foners. I have not yet heard of the Lofs of any other Officers of the fame Rank.

General Kienmayer was attacked on his March by Two Divisions from Aerding, and fuffered alfo

feverely in his Retreat, which he made upon Ifen in good Órder, on learning the Difaster that had be-fallen the Main Army.
