A T the Court at St. James's, the 31st of December 1800,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS, by virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an A&, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to au-" thorize His Majesty from Time to Time to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Provisions or Food," His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 10th of this instant December, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That from and after the Date of the faid Order, and until the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and one, no Person or Persons whatsoever should export, or should load or lay on board any Ship or other Vessel with the Intent to export, from any Port or Place in this Kingdom (except as excepted in the faid Order) the several Articles specified in the said Order: And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that it may be expedient to prevent the Exportation from this Kingdom of White Herrings and Red Herrings (except to Ireland), His Majesty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition contained in the faid above recited Order bearing Date the Tenth Instant, against the Exportation of the feveral Articles of Provision or Victual specified in the said Order, be extended to the Articles of White Herrings and Red Herrings; and that the same be not allowed to be exported from any Port or Place in this Kingdom, except to Ireland, and except as excepted in the faid Order bearing Date the Tenth of this inflant December: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Person or Persons whatsoever should export, or should load or lay on board any Ship or other Vessel with the Intent to export, from any Port or Place in this Kingdom (except as excepted in the faid Order) the several Articles specified in the said Order: And whereas, by the Sixth Article of the Articles of Union between Great Britain and Ireland, it is provided, That from and after the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and one, all Prohibitions and Bounties on the export of Articles, the Growth, Produce; or Manufacture of either Country, to the other, shall cease and determine, His Majesty is hereby pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That from and after the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and one, nothing contained in the above recited Order shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit the Exportation to Ireland of any of the Articles enumerated in the faid Order.

And whereas it has been represented to His Maint December: jelty, That it will be necessary from Time to Time to send Supplies of Provisions to the Garrisons belonging to the Honorable United Company of Mersteph. Gottrell.
