

jeſty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veſſel from taking or having on board ſuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceſſary for the Uſe of ſuch Ship or Veſſel during the Courſe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiſſioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the ſaid ſeveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majeſty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majeſty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weſt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majeſty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaſt of Africa, or to the Iſland of St. Helena, or to the Britiſh Settlements or Factories in the Eaſt Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the ſaid Articles, for the Purpoſes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majeſty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majeſty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weſt Indies, or to the Iſland of Newfoundland, or to His Majeſty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaſt of Africa, or to the Iſland of St. Helena, or to the Britiſh Settlements or Factories in the Eaſt Indies, the Exporters of ſuch Articles do firſt make Oath of the true Deſtination of the ſame to the Places for which they ſhall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the ſame ſhall be made, and do give full and ſufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiſſioners of His Majeſty's Cuſtoms, to carry the ſaid Articles to the Places for which they are ſo entered Outwards, and for the Purpoſes ſpecified, and none other; and ſuch Bond ſhall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the ſaid Commiſſioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the ſaid Commiſſioners, and ſpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in ſuch Form and Manner as ſhall be directed by the ſaid Commiſſioners, ſhewing that the ſaid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiſſioners of His Majeſty's Treasury, the Commiſſioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceſſary Directions herein, as to them may reſpectively appertain.

**T**HIS Day the Great Seal of Ireland being delivered up to His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant by the Right Honorable Arthur Lord Viſcount Kilwarden, Chief Juſtice of the Court of King's-Bench, and Barry Viſcount Avonmore, Chief Baron of the Court of Exchequer, Two of the Lords Commiſſioners for keeping the Great Seal of Ireland in the Lord Chancellor's Abſence,

the ſame was defaced in His Excellency's Preſence; and His Excellency was thereupon pleaſed to deliver to their Lordſhips a new Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to be uſed in that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, and to direct that the ſame be made Uſe of (pro tempore) for ſealing all Things whatever which paſs the Great Seal.
