My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I am confident that your Deliberations will be uniformly directed to the great Object of improving the Benefits of that happy Union, which, by the Bleffing of Providence, has now been effected; and of promoting, to the utmost, the Profperity of every Part of My Dominions.

You will, I doubt not, refume the Enquiries which were fo diligently profecuted in the laft Seffion of Parliament, as to the Left Means of relieving My Subjects from the Preflure of the prefent high Price of Provifions; and of preventing, as far as it can be done by human Forefight, the Recurrence of fimilar Difficulties. In these Endeavours, and in every Measure that can contribute to the Happiness of My People, the great End of all My Wishes, you may be affured of My cordial Concurrence.

You may rely on My availing Myfelf of the earlieft Opportunity which shall afford a Prospect of terminating' the prefent Contest, on Grounds confishent with Our Security and Honor, and with the Maintenance of those effential Rights on which Our Naval Strength must always principally depend.

It will afford Me the trueft and most heartfelt Sastisfaction whenever the Disposition of Our Euemies thall enable Me thus to reftore to the Subjects of My United Kingdom the Bleffings of Peace, and thereby confirm and augment those Advantages which refult from Our internal Situation, and which, even under all the Difficulties of War, have carried to fo great.an Extent the Agriculture, Manufacures, Commerce, and Revenue of the Country.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Data the Twenty-fixth Day of December, Oue thoufand feven hundred and ninety-two, to promife and declare, that the Bonnties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty' was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty

Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raile Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant January; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Re-ward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward he prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant January to the Thirtieth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and one, inclusive : Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves W. Fazukener. accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. // HEREAS His Majefty, by and with the VV Advice of His Privy Council, has been pleafed to caufe an Embargo to be laid upon Veffels belonging to the Subjects of Ruffia, Denmark, and Sweden now within, or which hereafter should come into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Perfons and Effects on board the faid Veffels : And whereas it has been reprefented to His Majefty, that the Goods on board feveral of the Vefiels fo detained by the Embargo are the Property of His Majesty's Subjects, or the Property of Perfons not being Subjects of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden, His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy, Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Goods laden on board Ruffian, Danish, or Swedish Vessels now detained under the faid Embargo, and intended to be exported, shall be delivered to the Difpofal of the Owners or their Agents, upon Affidavit made and produced to the Officer in whole Cultody the faid Veffels may be, that the faid Goods were not at the Time of Slipment, nor are now, the Property of the Subjects off Ruffia, Denmark, or Sweden; and allo, that all Goods which, by virtue of Licences under His Majefty's Sign Manual, have been imported in Verfels belonging to the Subjects of Ruflia, Denmark, or Sweden, shall in like Manner be forthwith de-livered to the Disposal of the Owners or their
