The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, has been pleased to cause an Embargo to be laid upon Vessels belonging to the Subjects of Russia, Denmark, and Sweden now within, or which hereafter should come into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Persons and Effects on board the said Vessels: And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that the Goods on board several of the Vessels so detained by the Embargo are the Property of His Majesty's Subjects, or the Property of Persons not being Subjects of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Goods laden on board Russian, Danish, or Swedish Vessels now detained under the said Embargo, and intended to be exported, shall be delivered to the Disposal of the Owners or their Agents, upon Affidavit made and produced to the Officer in whose Custody the said Vessels may be, that the said Goods were not at the Time of Shipment, nor are now, the Property of the Subjects of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden; and also, that all Goods which, by virtue of Licences under His Majesty's Sign Manual, have been imported in Vessels belonging to the Subjects of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden, shall in like Manner be forthwith delivered to the Disposal of the Owners or their Agents, on their making and producing a like Affidavit, and on sufficient Proof that His Majesty's Licence to import the said Goods had been obtained.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all Goods which have been imported into this Country in Russian, Danish, or Swedish Vessels without Licence under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and which are now detained by the Embargo, shall likewise be delivered to the Owners or their Agents, on Affidavit being made that such Goods were not at the Time of Shipment, nor are now, the Property of Subjects of Russia, Denmark,

or Sweden; and on their giving sufficient Bail to abide Adjudication, if any Proceedings should be commenced against the said Goods within Two Months from the Date of such Delivery; but in case no such Proceedings should be commenced within Two Months from the Date of such Delivery, then the Bond so given to be void:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appear.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Act, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to suspend, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and one, so much of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the Sixth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and one, and from thence to the End of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament, the manufacturing of any fine Flour from Wheat or other Grain; and the making of any Bread solely from the Fine Flour of Wheat; and to repeal an Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for permitting Bakers to make and sell certain Sorts of Bread, and to make more effectual Provision for the same;" as relates to other Grain than Wheat; and for indemnifying Persons who may have dressed, sold, or used any Meal or Flour of such other Grain finer than is prescribed by the said Act.

Extract of a Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, K. B. Admiral of the White, &c. to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Torbay, the 3d Instant.

S I R,

HIS Majesty's Ship Oiseau is this Instant arrived, and I enclose a Letter from Captain Linzee, giving an Account of the Capture of La Dedaigueuse French Frigate.

His Majesty's Ship L'Oiseau,
Torbay, Feb. 3, 1801.

MY LORD,

I Have the Honor to acquaint your Lordship, that on Monday the 26th of January at Eight A. M. in Lat. 45 Deg. North, Long. 12 Deg.

W.A. I fell in with the French National Frigate *La Dedaigueuse* of Thirty Six Guns and Three Hundred Men, with Dispatches from Cayenne for Rochfort, and chased her until Noon the following Day; when I discovered His Majesty's Ships *Sirius* and *Amethyst*, off Cape Finisterre, whose Captains I directed by Signal to chase, and continued in Pursuit of the Enemy until Two o'Clock on Wednesday Morning, being within Musket Shot, she opened her Fire on the *Sirius* and *Oiseau*, which was immediately returned, and surrendered to the above Ships after an Action of Forty five Minutes, distant from the Shore, near Cape Belem, about Two Miles; her running Rigging and Sails were cut to Pieces; several Men killed and Seventeen wounded, amongst the latter were the Captain and Fifth Lieutenant. My warmest Thanks are due to Captains King and Cooke for their Exertions, but particularly to the former, as from the *Sirius*'s steady and well-directed Fire, the Enemy received considerable Damage; the *Amethyst*, from unfavourable Winds, was unable to get up until she had struck. I am happy to say, notwithstanding the gallant Resistance made by the *Dedaigueuse*, neither of the Ships lost a Man; the *Sirius*'s Rigging and Sails were a little damaged, her Main-Yard and Bow-sprit slightly wounded. I cannot conclude without expressing my Approbation of the Officers and Company of His Majesty's Ship under my Command, and in Justice to them, must add, their Anxiety to close with the Enemy, on first discovering her, was equal to what it was on becoming so superior; and must further beg to acknowledge the very great Assistance I received from Mr. H. Lloyd my First Lieutenant, during a long and anxious Chase of Forty-two Hours; I trust your Lordship will be pleased to recommend him to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty as a most valuable Officer and deserving of their Attention; on his Account most sincerely do I lament the baffling Winds that prevented my bringing the Enemy to Action on the preceding Day, which I was several Times in Expectation of doing. *La Dedaigueuse* is a perfect new Frigate, Copper fastened, and sails well, carries Twenty-eight Twelve-Pounders on her Main Deck, and pierced for Forty Guns. I have given the Prize in Charge of my First Lieutenant with Directions to proceed to Plymouth; and have also to acquaint your Lordship of my having detained, on the 1st Instant, the Swedish Ship *Hoffnung*, from Valentia bound to Altona, laden with Brandy, Burthen Two Hundred and Sixty Tons.
