W.A. I fell in with the French National Frigate In Dedaigneuse of Thirty Six Guns and Three Hundred Men, with Difpatches from Cayenne for Rochfort, and chaced her until Noon the following Day; when I difcovered His Majefty's Ships Sirius and Amethyft, off Cape Finisterre, whole Captains I directed by Signal to chace, and continued in Purfuit of the Enemy until Two o'Clock on Wednefday Morning, being within Mufket Shot, fhe opened her Fire on the Sirius and Oifeau, which was immediately returned, and furrendered to the above Ships after an Action of Forty five Minutes, diftant from the Shore, near Cape Belem, about Two Miles; her running Rigging and Sails were cut to Pieces; feveral Men killed and Seventeen wounded, amongh the latter were the Captain and Fifth Lieutenant. My warmest Thanks are due to Captains King and Cooke for their Exertions, but particularly to the former, as from the Sirius's steady and well-directed Fire, the Enemy received con-fiderable Damage; the Amethyft, from unfavourable Winds, was unable to get up until fhe had ftruck. I am happy to fay, notwithstanding the gallant Re-tistance made by the Dedaigneuse, neither of the Ships loft a Man; the Sirius's Rigging and Sails were a little damaged, her Main-Yard and Bowsprit flightly wounded. I cannot conclude without expreffing my Approbation of the Officers and Com-pany of His Majefty's Ship under my Command, and in Justice to them, must add, their Anxiety to close with the Enemy, on first difcovering her, was equal to what it was on becoming fo fuperior; and must further beg to acknowledge the very great Assistance I received from Mr. H. Lloyd my First Lieutenant, during a long and anxious Chace of Fortytwo Hours; I truit your Lordship will be pleafed to recommend him to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty as a most valuable Officer and deferving of their Attention; on his Account moft fincerely do I lament the baffling Winds that pre-vented my bringing the Enemy to Action on the preceding Day, which I was feveral Times in Expectation of doing. La Dedaigneuse is a perfect new Frigate, Copper fastened, and fails well, carries Twenty eight Twelve-Pounders on her Main Deck, and pierced for Forty Guns. I have given the Prize in Charge of my First Lieutenant with Directions to proceed to Plymouth; and have alfo to acquaint your Lordship of my having detained, on the 1st Instant, the Swedish Ship Holsnung, from Valentia bound to Altona, laden with Brandy, Burthen Two Hundred and Sixty Tons.
