HIS Majesty doth hereby direct and require, that all the OUT PENSIONERS of CHELSEA HOSPITAL, residing in South Britain, who were discharged from their respective Corps as Corporals or Private Men (those resident in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, who are to attend at Chelsea on such Days as the Commissioners of the said Hospital shall appoint; the Out-Pensioners from the late Horse Guards and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horse Guards; such Men as by the Hospital Books are now more than Fifty-five Years of Age, or had served Twenty-five Years in the Army previously to their Discharges; and those who have lost an Eye or a Limb, excepted) do personally appear at the Places, and on the Days, hereinafter mentioned; in order that such
