Copy of a Letter from the Honorable Captain Charles Herbert, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Amelia, to the Earl of St. Vincent, K. B. Admiral of the White, &c. dated at Sea, the 5th of February 1801.

MY LORD,

I Have the Honor to inform your Lordship, that Two Hours ago, I captured the French Brig Privateer La Juste, of St. Maloes, but lost from L'Orient, armed with Fourteen Guns and Seventy-eight Men, commanded by Jean Pierre Charlet, had been out Thirty Days, and captured nothing; the Night being very dark, and the Weather being very thick, we did not see her till she was close to us, and she did not discover us till she was on board of us, by which she carried away her Foremast and Bowspit.
