PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by Order in Council, bearing Date the 28th of December 1796, His Ma jefty was pleafed, among other Things contained in the faid Order, to declare it to be His Pleafure, that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize which fhould be imported into the Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, or the Territories or Dependencies thereof, from any Part of His Majesty's Dominions should be fubject to any Duty; His Majefty having taken into His Royal Confideration the prefent State of the Trade, Commerce, and Revenues of the faid Settlement, and the Territories and Dependencies thereof, is hereby pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke, and doth hereby revoke fo much of the faid Order of the 28th of February 1796, as exempts from Duty any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize which shall, after due Notice to be given by the Governor of the faid Settlement, as hereinafter directed, be imported into the faid Settlement, or the Territories or Dependencies thereof, except Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Great Britain or Ireland; and fo-much of the faid Order shall, from and after such due Notice, cease and determine : And His Majelty is further pleafed to declare, and it is hereby declared, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the faid Settlement, and of the Territorics and Dependencies thereof, for the Time being, to impose on all Goode, Wares, and Merchandize not of the Growth, Pro duce, or Manufacture of Great Britain or Ireland, which shall be imported into the faid Settlement, or the Territories or Dependencies thereof, from any Part of His Majefty's Dominions, after fuch due Notice, a Duty not exceeding Ten per Cent. on the Value thereof, fuch Duty to be rated and col-4 Port shall have been appointed for the Performance

T the Court at St. James's, the 11th of | lected in the fame Manner as is in Ufe with regard to the Import Duty now levied at the faid Settlement, and the Territories and Dependencies thereof, from and in Ships and Veffels belonging to the Subjects of Countries and States in Amity with His Majelly, and upon the Goods and Merchans dizes imported in the fame.

> Provided always, That the Commencement of fuch Duty shall be fixed in the Proclamation, or other lawful Instrument, which shall be made and iffued by the faid Governor for the Purpole of impoling luch Duty, which Time shall not be less than Six Months from the Day of iffuing fuch Proclamation or other lawful Instrument: And provided alfo, That the Rate of Duty imposed on the Importation of Goods (not the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Great Britain or Ireland) from any Part of His Majefty's Dominions, when fo imported in British-built Veffels, owned and navigated according to Law, thall in no Cafe be fo high as that which shall be imposed on the like Goods fo imported in the Vessels of Foreign States.

THEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 14th of January laft, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That as often as any Ship or Veffel, the Cargo of which should confift of any of the Articles enumerated or deferibed in Section Thirty-eighth of His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 29th of July laft, concerning the Performance of Quarantine, fhould attempt to enter any Port or Place in Great Britain, or of the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, whether fuch
