HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Uner of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Assenged upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the Said Commission, empowering the Lord Archithe faid Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for reviving and continuing, until the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and one, so much of an Act, made in the Thirtyminth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His pre-fent Majesty, as relates to the reducing and better collecting the Duties payable on the Importation of Starch, for reviving, continuing, until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Selfion of Parliament, and amending an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for enabling His Majesty to permit Goods to be imported into Great Britain Neutral Ships; for reviving and continuing, until the Fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and four, and from thence until the Expiration of Six Weeks after the Commencement of the then next Schoon of Parliament, an Act, made in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for authorifing His Majesty to make Regulations respecting the Trade and Commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope; and for reviving and making perpetual an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for preventing Offences in obstructing, destroying, or damaging Ships, and in obstructing Seamen and others from purfuing their lawful Occupations.

An Act to extend, until the Twenty-ninth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and one, the Provisions of an Act, made in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled An Act for the better Cultivation, Improvement, and Regulation of the Common Arable Fields, Wastes, and Commons of Patture in this Kingdom, and for encouraging the Cultivation of Potatoes in Open and Common Field Lands.

An Act for enlarging, improving, and regulating the Cattle Market, within the City and County of

the City of Canterbury.

An Act for making and maintaining a convenient Carriage Road from the Botley Turnpike-Road on Curdvidge Common, in the Parish of Bishops Waltham, to join the Gosport Turnpike-Road at or near Filmenhill, in the Parish of Westmeon, with a Branch from the said Road on Corhampton Downto the Village of Corhampton, all in the County of

An Act for continuing the Term, and rendering more effectual Two Acts, made in the Second and Eleventh Years of the Reign of His prefent Ma-jefty, for Repairing and Widening the High Road leading from the North End of Ballingdon-Bridge, in Sudbury, in the County of Suffolk, to the South Gate, in Bury Saint Edmund's, in the faid County; and also for Repairing and Widening the High Road leading from the Place where the laid South Gate formerly stood, to the Place where the North Gate in Bury Saint Edmund's formerly

An Act for amending, widening, and repairing feveral Roads in the County of Carmarthen.

An Act for continuing for Twenty one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffind from thence to the Lind of the theat next segfion of Parliament, the Term, and altering and
enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the
Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Twentieth
Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair the Roads from Epson, through Ewell, to Tooting, and from Ewell to Kingston-upon-Thames and Thames Ditton, in the County of Surrey; and for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair the Road from the Turnpike-Road at Ewell, acrofs Ewell Common Fields, to the Ryegate Turnpike-Road on Borough Heath, in the faid County.

An Act for continuing and amending Two Acts, feverally passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and in the Twenty-sirst Year of the Reign
