S I R,

I Beg you to lay before their Lordships the enclosed Letter which I have received from Lieutenant Talbot, commanding the Sheerness Hired Armed Cutter, giving me an Account of his having captured a small French Privateer.

You will please, at the same Time, to acquaint their Lordships, that the Friendship Brig, which this Privateer had captured, was retaken on the Evening of the 29th Ultimo, by Lieutenant Rowed, in the Union Hired Armed Cutter, and sent into Portsmouth. I am, &c. &c. &c.
