An Act for reviving and further continuing, until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament, scveral Acts made in the Thirty-eighth, Thirty-ninth, and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, and in the last Seffion of Parliament, for empowering His Majesty to fecure and detain fuch Perfons as His Majefty shall fufpect are confpiring against his Person and Covernment.

An Act for the hetter Regulation of the Offic of Maîter of the Rolls in that Part of the Unite Kingdom called Ireland, and for augmenting the Salary annexed to the faid Office.



An Act Tor permitting 'East India Goods prohibited to be worn or used in Great Britain, and warchoufed, in purfuance of an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, to be removed by Land Carriage to certain Ports, for the Purpole of being exported to the British Colonies or Plantations in the Weit Indies.

An Act to render valid Indentures of Apprenticeship of Poor Children and others made upon improper Stamps upon certain Conditions, and to indemnify all Perfons who may have incurred Penalties thereby.

An Act for the better Collection of Rates made for the Relief of the Poor.

An Act for the indemnifying of Perfons injured by the forcible pulling down and demolifhing of Mills, or of Works thereunto belonging, by Perfons unlawfully and riotoufly affembled.
