Westminster, April 30, 1801.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money for the Service of Great Britain, to be raised by a Lottery.

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties of Customs on Timber, Sugar, Raisins, and Pepper imported into, and on Lead exported from, Great Britain.

An Act for repealing certain Duties upon Tea imported into Ireland, and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof, and for granting Additional Duties on Sugar and Coals imported into Ireland.

An Act for granting to His Majesty several Sums of Money for defraying the Charge of certain permanent Services in that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

An Act for granting an Additional Duty on English Spirits imported into Scotland, and for allowing until Forty Days after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, the Distillation of Spirits in Scotland from Molasses or Sugar at a lower Rate of Duty.

An Act for granting Bounties on the Importation into Ireland of Wheat, Barley, Rye, Oats, and Indian Corn, and of Barley, Rye, Oats, Indian Meal, and Wheaten Flour, and Rice.

An Act to revive and continue until the Fifth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and one, an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, An Act for shortening until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and one, the Time of keeping in Steep for Malting Barley damaged by Rain in the last Harvest.

An Act to revive and continue until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, an Act made in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act for the more effectually preventing Seditious Meetings and Assemblies.

An Act for levying Conversion Money in lieu of Statute Labour, and otherwise regulating, making, and repairing the High Roads in the County of Selkirk.

An Act for dividing, allotting, inclosing, draining, and preserving the Open Fields, Marsh Lands, Commons, Fens, and Waste Grounds, within the Parish of Hickling, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for dividing, allotting, inclosing, draining, and preserving the Open Fields, Marsh Lands, Commons, Fens, and Waste Grounds within the Parishes of Burgh and Billockby, in the County of Norfolk.

An Act for increasing the Rates of Subsistence to be paid to Innkeepers and others on Quartering Soldiers.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending, widening, making commodious, and keeping in Repair the Road from the Cross Keys, otherwise Bucker's Barn, in the Parish of Corsham, in the County of Wilts, to Bath Easton Bridge, in the County of Somerset.

 I Have to acquaint you, that, in executing your Instructions of the 15th Instant, on the Evening of the 16th, I fell in with and captured the *Noitra Signora del Carmen*, a Spanish Schooner Privateer mounting Six Guns, and having on board Sixty-five Men, sailed from Rigo the preceding Evening, bound on a Cruise; as she did not appear to me to be fit for His Majesty's Service, I destroyed her; and have the Honor to remain, Sir, &c.

 I Have the Honor to acquaint you, that this Morning, at Half past Six, off the North End of the Isle Lonzo, we chased a *Trabaccolo*, which anchored near the Isle Molata at Half past Eight, hoisted French Colours, and struck them on my firing one Shot; she proves to be the French Privateer *L'Achille*, commanded by Francisco Bruni, mounting Four Nine-Founders and Two Six Pounders Brass Cannon, with Forty-four Men, from Ancona one Day, and had made no Capture.
