Whitehall, May 16, 1801.

THE King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Earl of Leven and Melville to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The King has also been pleased to present John Marshall, Clerk, Master of Arts, to the Rectory of Epworth, in the Isle of Axholme, in the County and Diocese of Lincoln, vacant by the Death of John Robinson, Clerk, the last Incumbent.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint George Prevost, Esq; Brigadier-General of His Majesty's Forces, to be Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of St. Lucia, in America.

The King has also been pleased to constitute and appoint George Nugent, Esq; Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, to be Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Jamaica, in America, in the Room of Alexander Earl of Balcarres.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Mr. Archibald Burns to be Commissary of the Commissariat of Hamilton and Campsey, in the Room of Mr. Robert Frame, deceased.

The King has been pleased to grant unto James Rivett, of Bombay, Esq; in the Civil Service of the Honorable the United Company of Merchants trading to the East Indies upon their Establishment of Bombay, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue may assume and take the Surname of Carnac, and also bear the Arms of Carnac, (such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's-Office,) pursuant to the last Will and Testament of General John Carnac, late of Bombay aforesaid, deceased: and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Hugh Seymour, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Jamaica, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated 22d February 1801.

SIR,

I Herewith enclose a List of the Vessels taken, destroyed, or detained upon Suspicion by His Majesty's Squadron employed upon the Jamaica Station, under my Command, between the 3d of August 1800, and the 3d Instant.

Danish Sloop John, of 75 Tons, laden with Coffee: Taken by the York.

French Schooner La Toe, and Three others, of 15 Tons each, laden with Provisions and Coffee: Taken by Ditto.

Spanish Ship Mississippi, of 250 Tons, laden with Plank, Pitch, Snuff, and Medicines: Taken by Ditto.

Danish Ship Cromberg, of 200 Tons, laden with Logwood: Taken by Ditto.

American Ship Cleopatra, of 150 Tons, laden with Cotton and some Dollars: Taken by Ditto.

American Schooner Fair American, of 100 Tons, laden with Cotton: Taken by Ditto.

English Brig Sheerwater, of 85 Tons, laden with Butter and Flour: Recaptured by Ditto.
