'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth Day of October last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom of any Sort of Rock Salt, has expired: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fnould be renewed, and continue for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this His Majesty's Order, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or load or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Sort of Rock Salt whatfoever, without Leave and Permitfion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for indemnifying all Persons " who have been concerned in adviting or carrying into Execution an Order of His Majety in " Council respecting the Exportation of Rock Salt, " for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame, " for authoriting His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coastwife of Rock Salt, " and for making further Provisions relative there-" to:" His Majelly, nevertheless, by the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, that nothing herein contained shall prevent Rock Salt being carried Coastwife, under the usual Rules, Regulations, and Refrictions, nor the Exportation of the same to Ireland, or to any other of His Majesty's Dominions, under the utual Conditions and Regulations, and upon Security being given by the Exporter, and Two other Persons, (of whom the Master of the Vessel shall be one,) by Bond, in such Penalty as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Customs, that the faid Rock Salt shall be exported to some Port or Place in His Majesty's Dominions, and none other; and that a Certificate shall be produced, within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if such Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe; and within Twelve Months, if for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in America or the West In-dies; and within Eighteen Months, if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Asia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where such Rock Salt shall be so landed; and if there shall be no Officer of the Cultoms, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the said Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the same was entered out .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiraky, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth Day of October last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, (except as in the said Order is mentioned,) has expired: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be renewed and continued for some Time longer: His Majesty dosh therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this His Majesty's Order, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permission All or Fearl-Ain, without Leave or Fernandon being first had and obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures insticted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An "Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been "concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His tion an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits " in consequence of the same; for authorising His "Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making further Provision relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonics or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernfey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Scttlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they faull be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satiffaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Boud shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid
