INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP OF POOR CHILDREN AND OTHERS, MADE UPON IMPROPER STAMPS, RENDERED VALID.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, May 9, 1801.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, that, by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, Cap. 22. it is enacted, for Remedy of the Inconvenience which has arisen and may arise to Masters and Mistresses of Apprentices, and also to Apprentices, in respect to Indentures of Apprenticeship made for the binding Poor Children and others, which have, through Mistake or Inadvertency, been executed upon Stamps of a different Denomination and Value than required by the several Acts relating to the Stamp Duties, and therefore are not valid or binding on any of the Parties thereto,
