THE King, as Sovereign of the Moft Noble Order of the Garter, has been gracioufly pleafed, by Letters Patent under his Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, to difpenfe with all the Statutes and Regulations ufually observed in regard to Installation; and to give and grant unto their Royal Highnesses William Henry Duke of Clarence and St. Andrews, Edward Duke of Kent and Strathern, Erneft Augustus Duke of Cumberland and Teviotdale, Prince Augustus Frederick, and Prince Adolphus Frederick ; their Serene Highneffes William Landgrave of Heffe Caffel, and Erneft Duke of Saxe Gotha; Prince William, Son of His Royal Highnels the Duke of Glou-celler; as allo to Charles Duke of Richmond, William Duke of Devonshire, William Marquis of Lanslown, Henry Duke of Beaufort, George Marquis of Buckingham, Charles Marquis Cornwallis, Hugh Dake of Northumberland, John Earl of Chatham, James Marquis of Salifbury, John Earl of Weltmorland, Frederick Earl of Carbifle, Henry Duke of Buccleugh, William Henry Duke of Port-land, George John Earl Spencer, and John Jeffreys Earl Camden, Knights Elect of the faid Moft Noble Order, respectively, full Power and Authority to exercise all Rights and Privileges belonging to Knights Companions of the Molt Noble Order of the Garter, as if they had been formally installed; any Decree, Rule, or Ufage to the contrary notwithftanding.

At the Court at the Queen's Palate, June 3, 1801. The King, as Sovereign of the Molt Noble Order of the Garter, having, by Letters Patent under His Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing Date the Twenty-ninth Day of May last, difpenfed with the holding of a Chapter in Form, to fill the Stall vacant by the Death of Earl Howe, was this Day gracioufly pleafed to nominate John Duke of Roxburgh, his Groom of the Stole, to be a Knight Companion of the Moft Noble Order of the Garter; aud, affisted by their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Wales and Duke of York, to invell His Grace with the Garter, and the Ribband and George; the Lord Bifhop of Salifbury, Chancellor of the Molt Noble Order, pronouncing the usual Admonitions during the Ceremony.

And, on the fame Day, by Letters Patent under the Sovereign's Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, a Dispensation, similar to that which each of the Knights cleft had lately received, was granted to His Grace the Duke of Roxburgh.
