Islands in the West Indies, is, or shall be subject by Law: And His Majelly is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declued, That all Commodities being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the faid Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Enftatins being in His Majefty's Poffession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigable according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forseitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from Ilis Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Illands in the West Indiese And the Right Monotable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Land the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively apportain,

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's VV Order in Council of the Third Day of De-etmber 1st, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Constwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this infant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth there-fores with the Advice of His Privy Council, bereby order, require, probibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perions whatfoever (except the Malter-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this inflant June, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Compowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or hip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into my Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Lieuve or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majerty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act " to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Expont-" ation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for cm-" powering His Majelly to prohibit the Exportation " of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammuni-" tion; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain " the carrying Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder,

I HEREAS the Time limited by His Majetty's Order in Council of the Third Day of December laft, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitte, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this inftent June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to com-mence from the faid Tenth Day of this inflant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Vellel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitze, without Leave or Permillion being first had and obtained from His Ma-jelty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have " been concerned in advising of carrying into Exer ention an Order of the Lords Commissioners of "His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Asbes or Pearl-Asbes; for preventing Suite in consequence of the same; for authorizing His " Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coastwife of Pot Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making forther Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, neverthelese, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood called Ligaum Vitz, which may be receilary for the Use of the faid Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Ligaum Vitz to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or so the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Jilands of Guernfey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Mand of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements
