An Act for repairing the Road from the Borough of Leicester to Peterborough, in the County of Northampton, and for repealing Two Acts paffed for repairing the faid Road.

An Act for vefting certain Effates in the County of Norfolk, flrictly entailed by the Will of Horatio late Earl of Orford, deceafed, in Truftees to be fold, and for laying out the Money arifing therefrom, in the first Place in Discharge of the Incumbrances affecting the fame, and the Refidue thereof in the Purchase of other Estates in the County of Norfolk to be fettled to the fame Ules.

An Act for the Eftablishment of Schools for the Education of Poor Children in the County-Palatine of Durham.

An Act for vefting the Fee Simple and Inherit-ance of and in the Real Eflates devifed by the Will of Mary Pugh, Widow, deceased, fituate in the Counties of Carnarvon and Angleley, in Truftees and their Heirs, upon Truft, to compleat the Sales of fuch Parts thereof as have been fold under the Direction of the Court of Chancery, and by the like | Enlign James Winskill.
