PRESENT, The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth Day of January last, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of July next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this King-dom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Fourteenth Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakun, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores, or fhip or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiflion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, initialed "An Act to "enable His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of " Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammuni-"tion, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council :" But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall ex-tend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majetty, or em-ployed or freighted by His Majetty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Ma-jefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ule of

T the Court at the Queen's Houfe, the 27th of | fuch Ship or Veffel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the Britifh Settlements or Factories in the Eaft Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpoles of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majeity's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weit Indies, or to the Island of New-foundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commisfioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Committioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lotd Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions hereia, as to them may refpectively appertain. *W. Mercury, off Ancona, 26th May 1801.

HAving received Information by a small Vessel I captured Vessel I captured Yefferday from Ancona, that His Majefty's late Sloop Buil Dog was laying in the Mole of that Port ready for Sea, with Supplies on board for the French Army in Egypt; I judged it neceffary to make an Attempt to take or deftroy her with the Boats of the Mercury; and as our Succefs depended upon furprifing the Enemy, who was ignorant of our Arrival in the Adriatic, (the Fortifications about the Mole being too formidable to justify the Attempt in any other Way,) I therefore made fail directly for Ancona, and came to an Anchor, soon after it was dark, off the Mole; the Boats were accordingly prepared, and left the Ship at Half paft Ten o'Clock, under the Command of Mr. W. Mather, First Lieutenant, from whose good Conduct the Bull Dog was furprifed, and carried about Midnight, the Boats having got alongfide without being hailed by the Sentinels; the Alarm was, however, immediately given along the Mole, to which the Ship's Stern was fecured by the Two Ends of a Bower Cable, and Three Cables out a-head, thefe were foon cut by the People appointed for that Purpole, and the Boats began to tow, exposed to a heavy Fire of Cannon and Musketry from the Mole, but as there was a favourable light Breeze, the Sails were fet, and in lefs than an Hour the Ship got without Reach of the Batteries, and was completely ours, but unfortunately it fell calm, and a Current fetting her along the Coaft near the Shore, a Crowd of Boats (some of which were Gun Boats), filled with Men, came out to attack her; Mr. Mather now found his Situation extremely critical, having the Hatchways to guard to prevent the Enemy rifing from below, the Boat's Crews fatigued with rowing all Night, and the Gun-Boats approaching faft and raking the Ship, he had therefore the Mortification of feeling himfelf obliged to relinquish his Prize, after being in Possession of her above Three Hours, and unfortunately failed in feveral Attempts before he retreated, to fet her on Fire

The Moment I could difcover the Bull Dog was out of the Mole, I got the Mercury under Weigh, but it was almost a Calm and impossible to get near her, as fhe had drifted with the Current to a confiderable Diftance from where the Mercury lay, and we experienced the mortifying Difappointment of feeing her towed back to the very Spot from whence the had been fo gallantly taken ; it is neverthelefs fome Degree of Satisfaction to know, that her Voyage mult be at least delayed for a confiderable Time, if not quite defeated, her Masts and Yards being shot through and difabled in many Places, and the has received confiderable Damage in her Hull and Rig-

ging. The gallant Conduct of the Officers and Men employed upon this little Enterprife will, I trult, jefty's Ship under my Command, which reflects great I meet with your Lordship's Approbation; and it is

from a Defire of doing Juffice to their Merits that I have been drawn into this, otherwife unneceffarily, Iong Detail. I have to regret the Lofs of Two brave Fellows killed, and Four wounded upon this Occasion. The Enemy had above Twenty killed,

wounded and drowned.
