Have the Honor of inclofing, for the Information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Brifbane, of His Majelty's Ship the Doris, who commands the Frigates employed in watching the Enemy's Fleet at the Entrance of Breft Harbour, in which important Service he has fhewn a great Deal of Zeal and Enterprife.

This daring Exploit appears to me to fland as high in point of Credit to his Majefly's Arms, and Glory to those brave Officers and Men who have fo nobly atchieved it, as any of the Kind ever performed.

SIR, Doris, off St. Matthew's, July 22, 1801.
