## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. IS Majesty, in Council, was this Day pleased to declare His Grace William Henry Cavendish Duke of Portland Lord President of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and his Grace took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honorable Thomas Lord Pelham to be one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordship was, this Day, by His Majesty's Command, fworn One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

It is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Sixth Day of August next be further prorogued to Tuesday the Fiftcenth Day of September next.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Eleventh of February last, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into, or made useful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of August next; and whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be, in Part, continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever,

commence from the faid Twelfth Day of August next, presume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or ship, or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to exporting the same beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 2. and also by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 34: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Exportation of any of the aforesaid Articles from Great Britain to Ireland, or from Ireland to Great Britain, respectively, or to any Exportation of any of the faid Articles, by, or on board of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Vessels, or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of the faid Articles as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the course of her intended Voyage, or to any Exportation thereof by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or from the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, or from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons within the Limits of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, provided that in case of the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Ligg mits of Europe, either of Copper being a Navage do at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to Store, or of Copper capable of being converted.
