A^T the Court at Weymouth, the 30th of July 1801,

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled An Act to empower His Majefty to regulate the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until the figuing a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, and to declare the Ifle of Malta to be Part of Europe, reciting, that the Island of Malta, with the Dependencies thereof, are now in the Poffession of His Majesty, and that it is expedient, under the prefent Circumstances, that the Trade and Commerce to and from the fame should be regulated for a certain Time in fuch Manner as shall feem proper to His Majefty : It is enacted, that from and after the paffing of that Act, and until the figning a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Mceting of Parliament, it shall and may be lawful for His Majetty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders to be iffued from Time to Time, to give fuch Directions, and make fuch Regulations, touching the Trade and Commerce to and from the faid Ifle, and the Dependencies thereof as to His Majelty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Thing contained in an Act paffed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His Majefty King Charles the Second, intituled An A& for the encouraging and increasing of Shipping and Navigation, or in an Act paffed in the Seventh and Eighth Year of the Reign of His Majefty King William the Third, intituled An Act for preventing Frauds and regulating Abufes in the Plantation Trade, or any other Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, relating to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations, or any other Act or Acta of Parliament, Law, Ufage, or Cultom to the con. trary in anywife notwithstanding :

And whereas it is judged expedient that the Port of La Valette, in the Island of Malta, should be declared a Free Port for the Importation into and Exportation from the fame, of all Sorts of Goods and Merchandizes in trading Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of States in Amity with His Majefty ; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleafed to order and declare, and does hereby order and declare, That the Port of La Valette, in the Island of Malta, shall be taken to be, and is hereby made a Free Port, for the Importation into and Exportation frem the fame of all Sorts of Goods and Merchandizes in Trading Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of States ; in Amity with His Majelly, of whatever Buthen or in whatever Manner fuch Ships or Veffels may be navigated, and shall continue to be such Free Port until the figning of a definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, unless His Majefty shall, in the mean Time, otherwife order; subject neverthelefs to fuch Regulations for the Security of the Polleflion of the Ifland of Malta and its Dependencies, and the Protection of the Health of the Garrifon and Inhabitants thereof, as may be now in force, or shall, from Time to Time, be deemed neceffary or expedient in that Behalf :

And it is hereby further ordered, That the fame Drawbacks and Bounties, and upon the fame Terms and Conditions which now are or hereafter may be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of any Goods and Merchandizes to the Island of Minorca or to Gibraltar, shall and may be allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandizes to the Port of La Valette, in the Island of Malta.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Licutenant of Ireland, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. Stephy Comput-

PROCLAMATION, A For partioning fuch Seamen and Marines as have de-ferted, and faill return into His Majefty's Service on or before the First Day of September next.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to find Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have deferted from any of Our Ships, and shall be willing to return to Our Service : We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Deferters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the First Day of Sep-tember next; and We do hereby further promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Seamen as having deferted are now belonging to fome One of Our Ships (in which Ship they are hereby permitted to continue), and do declare that fuch Deferters shall be entitled to receive all Wages that may be due to them in the Ship from which they may have deferted, at the Time of fuch Defertion; and We do also hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deferted from Qur Service, and fhall, on or before the faid First Day of September next, furrender themfelves at the Head Quarters of the Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces; and We do hereby declare that all Seamen and Marines fo furrendering themfelves as aforefaid shall be released and difcharged from all Profecutions, Imprifonments, and Penalties commenced or incurred by Reafon of any fuch Offence: but We do hereby further declare that all fuch Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not, on or before the faid First Day of September next, furrender themfelves on board One of Our Ships or Veffels of War, or at the Head Quarters of the Marines eftablished at Portfmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to fome Recruiting Party of the faid Forces, or who fhall hereafter ablent themfelves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quar-ters, without Leave from their Commanding Offi-cers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being found guilty shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall duster the Punishment of Death, or luch other Punishment as they shall be xondemned to fuffer by Sentence of the faid Court.

Given at Our Court at Weymouth, the Thirtieth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and one, and in the Forty first Year of Our Reign. GOD fave the KING.

Copy of a Letter from Lord Viscount Nelson, K. B. Vice-Admiral of the Blue, Sc. to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated on board His Majefty's Ship Medufa. off Boulogne, the 4th Inftant.

SIR, HE Enemy's Veffels, Brigs, and Flats, (Lug-ger rigged,) and a Schooner, Twenty-four in Number, were this Morning, at Daylight, anchored in a Line in Front of the Town of Boulogne; the Wind being favorable for the Bombs to act, I made the Signal for them to weigh, and to throw Shells at the Veffels, but as little as poffible to annoy the Town; the Captains placed their Ships in the best possible Polition, and in a few Hours Three of the Flats and a Brig were funk ; and in the courfe of the Morning Six were on Shore, evidently much damaged; at Six in the Evening, being high Water, Five of the Veffels which had been a-ground, hauled with Difficulty into the Mole, the others remained under Water.; I believe the whole of the Veffels would have gone infide the Pier but for Want of Water. What Damage the Enemy have fuffained, beyond what we fee, is im-poffible to tell. The whole of this Affair is of no further 'Confequence, than to shew the Enemy they cannot, with Impunity, come outfide their Ports.

The Officers of Artillery threw the Shells with great Skill, and I am forry to fay that Captain Fyers, of the Royal Artillery, is flightly wounded in the Thigh by the burfting of an Enemy's Shell, and Two Seamen are alfo wounded.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Mudge, Commander of His Majefly's Ship La Conflame, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated at Sea, the 28th July 1801. SIR.

Beg you to acquaint my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that at Ten Yesterday Morning, Cape Ortegal South Four Miles, a large Brig and Lugger hove round the Point, tracing the Shore within a Quarter of a Mile, running down before the Wind; relying on the Spanish Charts I had in my Point Large to also to the Firm. I had in my Possession, 1 run fo close to the Firgu Rocks, as to oblige them to run through the Inner Channel, both receiving the Broadlide as they pall. The Stork, which was beating up, flood into the Bay, and by a well-directed Fire obliged the Brig to run on the Rocks directly under a high Cliff, which was defended by the Militia of the Country, who kept up a conflant, but ill directed Fire. Lieutenant Stupart, of this Ship, with the feveral Boats of the Stork, &c. gallantly pushed in and hove her off without Loss; she proved to be the El Cantara Privateer, mounting Eighteen Eighteen-Pounders, and Four Sixes, with One Hundred and Ten Men, had left Corunna the Night before, (with the Lugger of Ten Guns, which I also captured,) and had taken nothing.

PROCLAMATION FOR PARDONING DESERTERS.

War-Office, Luguft 4, 1801. W HEREAS it has been repretented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Oher of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an infiance of Ilis Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour : His Majesty has been gracioufly pleafed to grant his Free Pardon to all Deferters from his regular Land Forces, who fhall furrender themselves, on or before the 10th Day of September next, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole

Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Infpector General of the Recruititg Service in the Ific Marlborough. of Wight.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be fent to the Regiments from which they refpectively deferted, or be appointed to fuch Regiments as His Majelly may be pleafed to command; and, when fo placed, fhall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have bclonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other regular Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majefty is gracioufly pleafed to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon; and to

direct, that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, without being under the Neccility of declaring themfelves Deferters, in order to entitle them to the Benefit of this Pardon; and they shall not be liable, at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved : But this Claufe is not to extend to Deferters enlited by the Corps railing Recruits for General Service; which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon on declaring themfelves in the Ifle of Wight to be fuch, and being there transferred to fome eftablished Regigiment.

Auy Soldier who may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, fhall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.
