ap to her Lower Yards，baffled all our Endeavours， and an infeantaneous Dhicharge of her Guns and finall Arms，from about Two Hundred Soldiers on her Gunwale，knocked myfelf，Mr．Kirby，the Mafter of the Medufa，and Mr．Gore，a Midfhip－ m．n，with Two－Thirds of the Crew，upon our Backs into the Boat，all either killed or wounded defperately，the Barge and Cutter being on the Out－ fide，fheered off with the Tide，but the Flat Boat in which I was hung alongfide，and as there was not an Officer or Man left to govern her，mult have fallen into the Hands of the Enemy，had not Mr． Cathcart taken her in＇Tow，and carried her off．

Mr．Williams led his Subdivifion up to the Ene－ my with the mot intrepid Gallantry，took One Lug－ ger，and attacked a Brig，while his Crews，I am con－ cerned to fay，fuffered equally with ourfelves，nearly the Whole of his Boar＇s Crew were killed or waund－ ed；Lieutenant Pelley，who commanded the Me－ dufa＇s Launch，and the Honorable Mr．Maitland， MidMipman，were feverely wounded；and Mr．Wil－ liam Britlow，Mater＇s Mate，in the Medufa＇s Cut－ ter，under Lieutenant Stewart，was killed．

I now feel it my Dusy to affure your Lordhip， that nothing could furpals the Zeal，Courage，and Readinefs of every Defeription of Officer and Man under my Commant；and I am forry that my Words fall hort of their Merits，though we could not ac－ complifh the Object we were ordered to．

MY LORD，Ganet，Auguft 16， 1801.

ON the Night of the 15 th Inftant，the Third Di－ vifion of Boats which I had the Honor to command，affembled on board His Majefty＇s Ship York，agreeable to your Lordfhip＇s Directions，and at Eleven P．M．by Signal from the Medufa，pro－ ceeded，without Lofs of Time，to attack the Ene－ my＇s Flotilla，of Bonlogne，as directed by your Lordfhip；and as I thought it mont advifeable to endeavour to reduce the largeft Veffel tirft，I loft no Time in makiag the Attack；but in confequence of my leading the Divifion，and the Enemy opening a heavy Fire from feveral Batteries，thought it advifeable to give the Enemy as little Time as pof－ fible，cut the Tow－Rope，and did not wait for the other Boats，fo that it was fome little Time before the heavy Boats could get up；received fo many Shots through the Boat＇s Bottom，that I foon found her in a finking State，and as it was not pof－ fible to fop fo many Shot Holes，was obliged with the Men，to take to another Boat，and have the Plea－ fure to acquaint your Lordfhip，that I received parti－ cular Support from the Boats of His Majeft＇s Ship York，which foon came up with the reft of the Divi－ fion I had the Homor to commard；but finding no Pro－ fpect of Succefs and the Number of Men killed and wounded in the different Boats，and the conflant Fire from the Shere of Grape and fmall Arms，thought it for the Good of His Majeity＇s Service to withdraw the Boats between Two and Three in the Morning，as we could not board her，although every Iffort was made．

His Majghy＇s Ship T／rs，Sundaj Aug．16， 1801.
1 N confequence of Directions received from your Lordhip，I laft Night，on the Sigual being made on board the Medufa，left this Ship with the Boats of the Fourth Divifion，formed with two clofe Lines，and immediately joinet the ocher Divifions under the Stern of the Medufa，and from thence proceeded to put your Lordhip＇s Order into Exe－ cution，attacking the Welternmolt Part of the Ene－ my＇s Flotilla：but notwithfanding every Exertion ：rade，owing to the Rapidity of the Tide we could not，uatil near Day－light，get to the Weltward of any Part of the Enemy＇s Line；on approaching the Eafern part of which，in order to affit the Firft Divifion thein engaged，we met them return－ ing．Under thefe Circumfances，and the Day breaking apace，I judged it prudent to direct the Officers commanding the differeat Boats to return to their refpective Ships．

Difovery，off Boalogne， 1616 MY LORD， Ausuif 1801.
$I$ Beg Leave to make my Report to your Lord－ thip of the Four Howitzer Boats that I had the Honor to command，in the Attack of the Enemy laft Night．

Having led in to fupport Captain Parker＇s Diz vifion，keeping between his Lines until the Enemy opened their Fire on him，we keeping on towards the Pier until I was aground in the headmont Boat， then opened our Fire，and threw about Eight Shells into it；but，from the Strength of the Tide coming out of the Harbour，was not able to keep cur Sta－ tion off the Pier Head，but continued our Fire on the Camp，until the Enemy＇s Fire had totally nackened，and Captain Parker＇s Divifion had paffed withont me．I beg Leave to mention to your Lordhip，that i was ably fupported by the other Boats．Captain Broome and Liestenant Beam，of the Royal Artillery，did every Thing in their Power to annoy the Enemy．The other Of－ ficers of Arrillery were detached in the other Four Howitzer Boats．
