He Turkish Chiaus which lately arrived at Pielaskowits, where the Court now is, has had Audience of the King; he was fent only by the Bassa of Caminiec, to make the King a Compliment in his Name, and to defire his Majesty, to appoint Commissioners to meet with those of the Grand Signior, for the adjusting the Limits. In the mean time Prince Wisnowitski, the Crown-General, lies Encamped with the Forces he has drawn together near Leopold, to observe the motions of the Turks, who, we are told, by the Advices we receive from several parts, intend to act only Defenfively this Summer, while they make throughout all the Ottoman Dominions, great preparations against next Spring.

Florence, Aug. 6. From Mantoua we have an Account, that that Duke had some days before, had a fall from his Horse; that he had ever since been troubled with a great pain in his Breaft, which gave a suspition of some dangerous inward Bruise, and made the pretenders to his Succession very busie at that Court. The French are going to make a great Haven at Antibo, capable to receive a Royal Fleet, for whose Security a great Fortress is to be built there. From Naples they write, that the Sieur du Quesne, after having cruised some time on those Coasts, with the men of War under his Command. had left those Seas, and as it was reported, was gone to joyn the twelve Gallies, Commanded by the Chevalier de Noailles, and then to take their course together for Tripoli, to oblige those Pyrats to make a Peace. That the Mountain of Vesuvia had lately cast up great quantities of Sulphurous Matter, which had destroyed the neighboring Vineyards. The Duke of Savoy has been ill of an Ague, but is now pretty well again, his Distemper having, its hoped, lest him. From Sicily they assure us, That the Mesfineles, who left Messina with the French, are now feveral of them at Constantinople, solliciting the Assistance of the Grand Signior.

Madrid, Aug. 8. The Prince of Parma, who is to

fucceed the Duke de Villa Hermosa in the Government of the Spanish Netherlands, has fixed his Departure for the 12th Instant; and the men of War that are to Transport him, and the Troops that go with him, are ordered to be ready at the Groyne on the 15th. Lintz, Aug. 10. The Imperial Court will remove from hence to Vienna about the beginning of Odo-

ber, that Place, which was one of the first that was Afflicted with the Plague, being now in perfect Health, when Prague, and many other places in the Emperors Hereditary Countreys, and elsewhere, are in a very deplorable condition. Several Persons of the chiefest Quality, who have long laboured to put an end to the Miseries and Devastations which the Kingdom of Hungary has of late years groaned under, though they have not hitherto reaped any fruit of those their unwearied pains, yet still continue to employ themselves in so good a work, and there are some that will flatter themselves, that they will at last succeed in it, and without doubt they would, were not the chief of the Hungarian Rebels influenced more by the confideration of their own private Interests, than that of the publick good, which they make their pretence. The Imperial Troops are in the mean time marching towards the place appointed for their Rendezvous on the Frontiers of Hungary, and it's hoped the Hungarians, when they see so con derable a Body drawing together against them, will be the more dispofed to accept of the Overtures that are made to them in order to a Peace.

Strasburg, Aug 16. We are affured that Monsieur de Louvoy will be in Alface before the end of this month; though it's faid, he comes only to give Orders about the new Fortifications that are making at Schlestadt and other places. The Deputies of this City will in few days begin their Conferences with those of the Bilhop of Strasburg, concerning his pretensions upon this City, which it's hoped will be amically determined, and the ill Conf.qu nces they may otherwise have, prevented. The 14th In-stant Count Mansfelt, the Emperrise Envoye to the French King, arrived at Stolboffen, three Leagues from hence, where he will expect faither Orders from the Entperor. Monfieur de Monclar is gone to wait upon the King at Stenay; his Troops in the mean time are encamped between Brumats and Herlesheim, which is about three Leagues from this City, and there, it's believed, they will continue till his return.

Berlin, Aug. 18. Yesterday the Elector of Brandenburg, who has spent a fortnight in this place, returned to Postdam. Our Letters from Poland say, That that King was endeavouring to secure the Succession of the Crown to his eldest son, and that that occasioned some Discontents among the Nobi-
