Amsterdam, Aug. 23. The Electoral Prince Palatine being returned hither from the *Hague*, parted again yesterday for the *Texel*, to Embark there on an English Ship of 36 Guns for *England*. The Heer *Van Staxenberg*, Ambassador from this State at *Paris*, has now Orders to remain there till the return of the Court from *Flanders*, which is expected at *St. Germain*s on the 30th Instant.

Hague, Aug. 23. The Imperial Minister here having formerly presented a Memorial to the States-General, in favour of the Elector of *Cologne*, who has with very earnest and repeated Instances, demanded the Restitution of *Hasselt* and *Maseyck*; he has thereupon had a Conference with the Deputies of this State; and the Endeavours of the said Minister have had that good Effect, that the States to preserve a good Correspondence and Friendship with the Elector, seem disposed to restore the said places to that Prince, who in return, is to pay a considerable Sum to the States, for the Damages their Subjects in the Mayery of *Bolduc* sustained by his Troops during the late War. The States as we are informed, have given fresh Orders to their Ambassador in *France*, to interpose his best Offices in behalf of the Elector Palatine, who continues to make great Complaints against the Proceedings of the French Officers. The Spanish Envoye here is gone for *Brussels*, to consult, as is reported, with the Duke de *Villa Hermosa*, upon some important Affairs; but the more probable opinion is, that the occasion of his Journey, is only to take his leave of his Excellency before his departure for *Spain*. Mr. *Sidney* continues still with the Court at *Dieren*, and will not be here till towards the latter end of the next week.

Hague, Aug. 26. The Sieur *Dickwaelt*, late one of the Ambassadors of this State in *France*, has Orders in his return from *Paris*, to remain some time at *Brussels*. The Minister of the Duke of *Zell* has presented a Memorial to the States-General, concerning some Arrears of Subsidies which are yet due to his Master, and Amount to 62500 Guilders. The Electoral Prince Palatine continues still at the *Texel*, being detained there by bad weather.

Brussels, Aug. 20. The Duke de *Villa Hermosa* has Declared his Resolution of parting hence on Wednesday next for *Flanders*; he will not be abroad above ten days, though he intends to visit *Offend*, and *Newport*, and to take a review of all the Cavalry of *Flanders* at some convenient place, between *Bruges* and *Courtray*. The Marquis de *Bourgoinerot* and Don *Bernardo de Salinas* will now in few days begin their Journeys, the first for *Vienna*, and the other for *Copenhagen*. Yesterday arrived here the young Prince of *Furstenburg*, with the Princess his Wife, and several other Persons of Quality, who are going for *Paris*, and intend to be there again, till the return of the Court at *St. Germain*s.

Brussels, Aug. 23. These parts are at present very quiet; the fears we were in of the French, being quite pass for this time, and now we are preparing for the arrival of our new Governor the Prince of *Parma*, who its said will be here in the beginning of the next Month.

Brussels, Aug. 27. The French Court is now returning towards *Paris*, and will be in 7 or 8 days at *Versailles* or *St. Germain*s. Here has been published a Prophecy of two Persons, who are said to be

now at *Tholouse* in *France*, which is not only very ridiculous in it self, but is the same that was published several years since with no other alteration, but that that spoke of the year 1670. what this says of 1690.

Pendennis, Aug. 16. The last week came into this Harbor a Dutch man of War of 28 Guns, Capt. *Andrickson* Commander, bound for *Curassow*, to fetch home the Governor. The *Speedwel*, of *London*, bound for *Amsterdam* from the *Barbados* is still here.

Falmouth, Aug. 16. On Friday night last was cast away in *Mounts Bay*, the *Golden Head* of *Amsterdam*, laden with Clapboards for *Bordeaux*; the Men, who were 18. being all saved. We have had very stormy weather for three days past.

Plymouth, Aug. 17. On Friday and Saturday last the weather was very stormy, and two Ships belonging to this Town were driven ashore, where one of them broke in pieces, but the other got off again. The *Norwich* Frigate, Capt. *Haywood* Commander, bound with several Merchant Ships for the *West-Indies*, is still waiting here for a fair wind.

Portsmouth, Aug. 19. Yesterday the *Falcon* Frigate, sailed from *Spithead* for the *Downs*. The *Sweepstakes*, and the Merchant Ships under her Convoy, are now under sail with a fair wind.

Whitehall, Aug. 22. This day arrived his Highness the Electoral Prince Palatine.
