Copy of a Letter from the Honorable William Corn-wallis, Admiral of the Blue, &c. to Evan Nepean, Efg; dated off Ufbant the 20th Inflant.

SIR,

Have the Honor to transmit to you, for the Information of the Lords Commillioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Wemyfs, of His Majeity's Ship the Unicorn, enclosing One from Captain Griffiths, of the Atalante Sloop, both flationed in watching the Coast of Quiberon.

His Majefly's Ship Unicorn, Quiberon Bay, 14th August 1801.

SIR, DY His Majefty's Sloop Atalante (which I have fent to you, being thort of Provisions,) I en-close a Journal of my Proceedings and Statement of the Ship, by which you will fee we have barely a a Month's Provisions.

Hitherto, notwithstanding all my Exertions in sending the Boats away armed on different Occafions, and moving with the Ship, I have only been able to capture One Chaile Marce, of Forty Tons, laden with Lime, not worth fending in, (in which Business we had the Missortune to have One Seaman killed, and One flightly wounded,) and to deftroy One, fame Burthen, laden with Corn.

Several Convoys are laying at different Places, Page 1032, ready to flip out; the largeft of which, (in the Fifty Days.

Morbihan,) by anchoring near that Place, and com-manding the Pallages to the Weilward, I have prevented moving

His Majesty's Sloop Atalante has been rather more fortunate, having captured Three fmall light Boats, and L'Eveille Armed Lugger. The Gallantry of this Affair, to which I was an Eye-witnels, is fully mentioned in Captain Griffiths's Letter, a Copy of which I enclose, and beg Leave to fay he speaks my Sentiments on that Subject.

SIR, Atalante, Quiberon-Bay, Aug. 11, 1801. I Have to acquaint you, for the Information of the Commander in Chief, that Yellerday the Six-oared Cutter of His Majelty's Sloop under my Command, manned with Eight Men, captured the French Armed Lugger L'Eveillé, in the Service of the Republic, of Fifty-eight Tons, mounting Two Four Pounders and Four large Swivels, carrying a Pound and Half Ball; the cool Intrepidity with which they rowed up in face of a brifk Difcharge of Cannifter and Grape from the Lugger; and the crofs Fire of Two fmall Batteries, could not fail to excite my Admiration; they boarded and took her a Mufket-Shot from the Shore; (the Crew deferting her at the Moment,) and I am happy to add, brought her off without any Body hurt on our Part.

The fleady Determination and good Conduct of Mr. Francis Smith (who commanded) claims my fulleft Approbation; and I truft I may be permitted strongly to recommend him to Notice, as well as to express my Thanks to the Boat's Crew who fo ably feconded him.
