PROCLAMATION FOR PARDONING DESERTERS.

War-Office, August 4, 1801. WHEREAS it has been repretented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an infrance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour: His Majesty has been gra-ciousily pleased to grant his Free Pardon to all Deferters from his regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themfelves, on or before the 10th Day of September next, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole
