The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS by Order in Council, dated the Tenth of December laft, it was ordered by His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in His Majefty, by an Act paffed in the Forty-first Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to au-"thorize His Majefty, from Time to Time, to pro-"this the Exportation of Provisions or Food," and mentioned in the faid Order, that from and after the Date of the faid Order, until the First Day of October next, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, fhould export, or should load or lay on board any Ship or other Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place in this Kingdom, the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, Bacon, Butter, Cheefe, Onions, Potatoes, and Pulfe of any Sort, Barley hulled, or Pearl Barley, fubject to the Provisions and Exceptions in the faid Order contained: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Fime longer; His Majelly, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers velted in His Majefty by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Prohibition to export, or to lay on board any Ship or Veffel, with Intent to export any of the Articles as aforefaid, shall continue and remain in force until the Expiration of Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament, subject to the like Provisions and Exceptions as are contained in His Majesty's faid Or-dcr of the Tenth December last, and in a fubfequent Order of His Majefty in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth of the faid Month of Decem-ber; and the Right Honorable the Lords Com-millioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
