AT the Court at Weymouth，the 7 th of $S_{j} \beta$ ． temper 1801,
PRESENT, The KING＇s Mot Excellent Majefty in Council． HEREAS by Order in Council，dated the Tenth of December lat，it was ordered by His Majelly，by and with the Advice of His：Privy Council，in purfuance of the Powers vetted in His Majefty，by an Act paffed in the Forty－firt Year of His Majefty＇s Reign，intituled，＂An Act to an－ ＂theorize His Majelty，from Time to Time，to pro－ ＂habit the Exportation of Provifions or Food；＂ and mentioned in the faid Order，that from and after the Date of the faid Order，until the Fir Day of October next，no Perron or Perfons what－ forever，fhould export，or should load or lay on board any Ship or other Veffel，with the Intent to export from any Port or Place in this Kingdom， the following Articles，viz．Bulls，Cows，Oxen， Calves，Sheep，Lambs，Swine，Beef，Pork，Mutton， Veal，Lamb，whether fatted or otherwife，Bacon， Butter，Cheefes，Onions，Potatoes，and Pulfe of any Sort，Barley hulled，or Pear！Barley，fubject to the Provifions and Exceptions in the laid Order contained：And whereas it is judged expedient that the fad Prohibition mould be continued for forme Time longer；His Majefty，therefore，by and with the Advice of His Privy Council，purfuant to the Powers velled in His Majesty by the fad Act， hath thought fit to order，and it is hereby ordered， that the fard Prohibition to export，or to lay on board any Ship or Veficl，with Intent to export any of the Articles as aforefaid，hall continue and re－ main in force until the Expiation of Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Sellion of Parliament，subject to the like Provilions and Ex captions as are contained in His Majeity＇s raid Or－ der of the Tenth December lat，and in a fubfe－ quant Order of His Majefty in Council，bearing Date the Thirtieth of the Said Month of Deem－ Der；and the Right Honorable the Lords Com－ mitioners of His Majefty＇s Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly．
