Extract of a Difpatch from Lord Elgin to Lord Hawkefbury, dated Conflantinople, September 6, 1801, Midnight.

Congratulate your Lordship most fincerely, on the Intelligence which I have this Moment received by the annexed Letter from Sir John H. Hutchinfon.

Extract of a Letter from Sir John Hely Hutchinfon, K. B. to the Earl of Elgin, dated Head-Quarters, Camp before Alexandria, August 27, 1801.

I Just feize the Opportunity of a Mellenger going L to Constantinople, (dispatched by the Capitan Pacha,) to inform your Excellency, that General Menou offered last Night to capitulate for the Town and Forts of Alexandria, and demanded an Armistice of Three Days for the Purpole of ar-ranging the Terms of the Capitulation; this I have granted accordingly.
