DISPATCHES, of which the following are Extracts, have been received from His Excellency the Earl of Elgin, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Sublime Porte, by the Right Honorable Lord Hawkebury, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Extract of a Dispatch from Lord Elgin to Lord Hawkebury, dated Constantinople, September 6, 1801, Midnight.

I Congratulate your Lordship most sincerely, on the Intelligence which I have this Moment received by the annexed Letter from Sir John H. Hutchinson.

Extract of a Letter from Sir John Hely Hutchinson, K. B. to the Earl of Elgin, dated Head-Quarters, Camp before Alexandria, August 27, 1801.

I Just seize the Opportunity of a Messenger going to Constantinople, (dispatched by the Capitan Pacha,) to inform your Excellency, that General Menou offered last Night to capitulate for the Town and Forts of Alexandria, and demanded an Armistice of Three Days for the Purpose of arranging the Terms of the Capitulation; this I have granted accordingly.

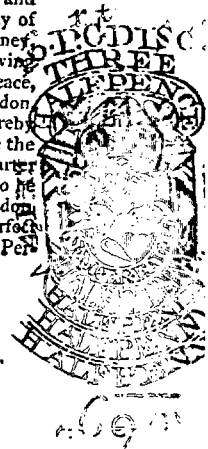
