A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Thirtyfeventh Year of Our Reign, intituled "An "Act to shorten the Time now required for giving " Notice of the Royal Intention of His Majeffy, His "Heirs and Succeffors, that the Parliament shall "meet and be holden for the Difpatch of Business, " and more effectually to provide for the Meeting " of Parliament in the Cafe of a Demife of the " Crown;" and reciting that it is expedient to fhorten the Time required for giving Notice of the Royal Intention of Us, Our Heirs, or Succeffors, that the Parliament fhould meet and be holden for the Difpatch of Bufinels; it is enacted, that whenever We fhall be pleafed, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue Our Royal Proclamation, giving Notice of Our Royal Intention that Par-liament thall meet and be holden for the Difpatch of Bulineis, on any Day, being not lefs than Four-teen Days from the Date of fuch Proclamation, the fame thall be a full and fufficient Notice to all Perfons whatever of fuch Our Royal Intention; and the Parliament shall thereby sland prorogued to the Day and Place therein-declared. And foraf-much as, for certain Caufes, We are defirous that Our Parliament which now flands prorogued to Thurfday the Twenty-fecond Day of this inflant October, without Notice having been given requiring the fame then to meet for the Difpatch of Bufinefs, fhould meet on an early Day thereafter for the Difpatch thereof, We, by and with the Ad-vice of Our Privy Council, do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, publish and declare Our Royal Will and Intention, that Our faid Parliament shall ftand prorogued to, and fhall meet and be holden on Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, for the Difpatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on

the faid Twenty-ninth Day of this prefent Month of October.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Houfe the Sixth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and one, in the Forty-first Year of Our Reign.
