A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Cessation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, agreed upon between His Majesty and the French Republic, and enjoining the Observance thereof.

GEORGE R:

WHEREAS Preliminaries for restoring Peace between Us and the French Republic were signed at London on the First Day of this instant October, by the Plenipotentiary of Us, and by the Plenipotentiary of the French Republic: And whereas, for the putting an End to the Calamities of War, as soon and as far as may be possible, it hath been agreed between Us, and the French Republic, as follows; that is to say, That as soon as the Preliminaries shall be signed and ratified, Friendship should be established between Us and the French Republic, by Sea and Land, in all Parts of the World, and that all Hostilities should cease immediately; and in order to prevent all Causes of Complaint and Dispute which might arise on account of Prizes which might be made at Sea, after the Signature of the Preliminary Articles, it has been also reciprocally agreed, That the Vessels and Effects which might be taken in the British Channel and in the North Seas, after the Space of Twelve Days, to be computed from the Exchange of the Ratifications of the Preliminary Articles, should be restored on each Side; That the Term should be One Month from the British Channel and the North Seas as far as the Canary Islands inclusively, whether in the Ocean or in the Mediterranean; Two Months from the said Canary Islands, as far as the Equator; and lastly, Five Months in all other Parts of the World, without any Exception, or any more particular Description of Time or Place: And whereas the Ratifications of the said Preliminary Articles between Us and the French Republic were exchanged by the respective Plenipotentiaries of Us, and of the French

Republic, on the Tenth Day of this instant October, from which Day the several Terms above-mentioned of Twelve Days, of One Month, of Two Months, and Five Months, are to be computed: And whereas it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the Cessation of Hostilities between Us and the French Republic should be agreeable to the several Epochs fixed between Us and the French Republic, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to notify the same to all Our loving Subjects; and We do declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and We do hereby strictly charge and command all Our Officers both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjects whatsoever, to forbear all Acts of Hostility, either by Sea or Land, against the French Republic, and their Allies, their Vassals or Subjects, from and after the respective Times above-mentioned, and under the Penalty of incurring Our highest Displeasure.

Given at Our Court at *Windsor*, the Twelfth Day of this instant October, in the Forty-first Year of Our Reign, and in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one.

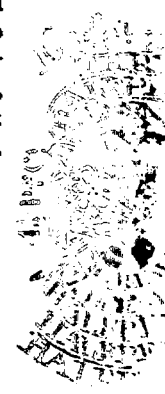

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, of the Twenty-first of May last, to direct that the several Bounties therein mentioned, should continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman, and Able-bodied Landman, who should voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Navy, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this instant October; and also that the Reward therein mentioned for discovering Able and Ordinary Seamen, who should secrete themselves, should likewise continue to be paid to any Person who should discover such Seaman, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service: His Majesty having this Day taken the said Order into consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare, That the said Bounties and Reward shall from henceforth cease, determine, and be no longer paid or payable, any Thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. *W. A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-seventh Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to shorten the Time now required for giving Notice of the Royal Intention of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, that the Parliament shall meet and be holden for the Dispatch of Business, and more effectually to provide for the Meeting of Parliament in the Case of a Demise of the Crown;" and reciting that it is expedient to shorten the Time required for giving Notice of the Royal Intention of Us, Our Heirs, or Successors, that the Parliament should meet and be holden for the Dispatch of Business; it is enacted, that whenever We shall be pleased, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue Our Royal Proclamation, giving Notice of Our Royal Intention that Parliament shall meet and be holden for the Dispatch of Business, on any Day, being not less than Fourteen Days from the Date of such Proclamation, the same shall be a full and sufficient Notice to all Persons whatever of such Our Royal Intention; and the Parliament shall thereby stand prorogued to the Day and Place therein-declared. And forasmuch as, for certain Causes, We are desirous that Our Parliament which now stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-second Day of this instant October, without Notice having been given requiring the same then to meet for the Dispatch of Business, should meet on an early Day thereafter for the Dispatch thereof, We, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, publish and declare Our Royal Will and Intention, that Our said Parliament shall stand prorogued to, and shall meet and be holden

on Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights Citizens, and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Twenty-ninth Day of this present Month of October.

NEW STAMP DUTIES ON DEEDS, &c.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, July 3, 1801.
IN pursuance of Directions received from the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That, in order to prevent any Inconvenience to those Persons in the different Parts of the Kingdom, who shall not have been able to supply themselves with Vellum, Parchment, and Paper stamped according to an Act of Parliament, to which the Royal Assent was given Yesterday, owing to the Period for its Commencement taking place so soon after the passing thereof, here is a Clause in the said Act, empowering the Commissioner to cause such Instruments, viz. any Indenture, Lease, or other Deed, charged with an additional Duty of Three Shillings by an Act of the Thirty-seventh of the King, Cap. 90. as may, through Necessity, have been executed by any, or all of the Parties, upon Stamps in Use previous to the Year 1801, to be stamped with the additional Duties of FIVE SHILLINGS granted by Two Acts of the last Session of Parliament, on Payment of the said Duties only, without any Penalty, provided the same shall be brought or sent to the Head Office in Somerset-Place, before the ensuing 5th of December.
