

scription of Time or Place: And whereas the Ratifications of the said Preliminary Articles between Us and the French Republic were exchanged by the respective Plenipotentiaries of Us, and of the French Republic, on the Tenth Day of this instant October, from which Day the several Terms above-mentioned of Twelve Days, of One Month, of Two Months, and Five Months, are to be computed: And whereas it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the Cessation of Hostilities between Us and the French Republic should be agreeable to the several Epochs fixed between Us and the French Republic, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to notify the same to all Our loving Subjects; and We do declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and We do hereby strictly charge and command all Our Officers both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjects whatsoever, to forbear all Acts of Hostility, either by Sea or Land, against the French Republic, and their Allies, their Vassals or Subjects, from and after the respective Times above-mentioned, and under the Penalty of incurring Our highest Displeasure.

Given at Our Court at *Windsor*, the Twelfth Day of this instant October, in the Forty-first Year of Our Reign, and in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to declare and order, that, for the Convenience and Security of the Commerce of His loving Subjects, during the Cessation of Arms notified by His Royal Proclamation of this Day's Date, Passes will be delivered, as soon as they can be interchanged, to such of His Subjects as shall desire the same, for their Ships, Goods, and Merchandizes, and Effects, they duly observing the several Acts of Parliament which are or may be in Force. *W. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, of the Twenty-first of May last, to direct that the several Bounties therein mentioned, should continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman, and Able-bodied Landman, who should voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Navy, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this instant October; and also that the Reward therein mentioned for discovering Able and Ordinary Seamen, who should secrete themselves, should likewise continue to be paid to any Person who should discover such Seamen, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service: His Majesty having this Day taken the said Order into consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare, That the said Bounties and Reward shall from henceforth cease, determine,

and be no longer paid or payable, any Thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. *W. Fawkener.*
