Westminster, October 29, 1801.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to make the following most gracious Speech :

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that the important Negotiations, in which I was engaged at the Close of the last Session of Parliament, are brought to a favourable Conclusion. The Differences with the Northern Powers have been adjusted by a Convention with the Emperor of Russia, to which the Kings of Denmark and Sweden have expressed their Readiness to accede. The essential Rights for which We contended are thereby secured, and Provision is made that the Exercise of them shall be attended with as little Molestation as possible to the Subjects of the contracting Parties.

Preliminaries of Peace have also been ratified between Me and the French Republic; and I trust that this important Arrangement, whilst it manifests the Justice and Moderation of My Views, will also be found conducive to the substantial Interests of this Country, and honorable to the British Character :— Copies of these Papers shall forthwith be laid before you; and I earnestly hope that the Transactions to which they refer will meet with the Approbation of My Parliament.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have directed such Estimates to be prepared of the various Demands for the public Service as appear to Me to be best adapted to the Situation in which We are now placed. It is painful to Me to reflect that Provision cannot be made for defraying

the Expences which must unavoidably be continued, for a Time, in different Parts of the World, and for maintaining an adequate Peace Establishment, without large additional Supplies. You may, however, be assured that all possible Attention shall be paid to such economical Arrangements as may not be inconsistent with the great Object of effectually providing for the Security of all My Dominions.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I cannot sufficiently describe the Gratification and Comfort I derive from the Relief, which the Bounty of Divine Providence has afforded to My People, by the abundant Produce of the late Harvest :—In contemplating the Situation of the Country at this important Conjuncture, it is impossible for Me to refrain from expressing the deep Sense I entertain of the Temper and Fortitude which have been manifested by all Descriptions of My faithful Subjects, under the various and complicated Difficulties with which they have had to contend.

The distinguished Valour and eminent Services of My Forces by Sea and Land, which, at no Period, have been surpassed; the unprecedented Exertions of the Militia and Fencibles; and the Zeal and Perseverance of the Yeomanry and Volunteer Corps of Cavalry and Infantry, are entitled to My warmest Acknowledgments; and I am persuaded, that you will join with Me in reflecting, with peculiar Satisfaction, on the Naval and Military Operations of the last Campaign; and on the successful and glorious Issue of the Expedition to Egypt, which has been marked throughout by Achievements, tending, in their Consequences and by their Example, to produce lasting Advantage and Honor to this Country.

It is My first Wish, and most fervent Prayer, that My People may experience the Reward they have so well merited, in a full Enjoyment of the Blessings of Peace, in a progressive Increase of the National Commerce, Credit, and Resources; and, above all, in the undisturbed Possession of their Religion, Laws, and Liberties, under the Safeguard and Pro-



fection of that Constitution, which it has been the great Object of all Our Efforts to preserve, and which it is Our most sacred Duty to transmit, unimpaired, to Our Descendants.

Downing-Street, October 29, 1801.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Marquis Cornwallis to be His Plenipotentiary at the Congress to be held at Amiens; and also to appoint Anthony Merry, Esquire, to execute the Office of His Majesty's Secretary at the said Congress.

Whitehall, October 31, 1801.

The King has been graciously pleased to grant His Royal Licence and Authority unto Matthew Chitty Darby, Esq; Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, and Captain in the First Regiment of Foot Guards, that he and his Issue, may take and use the Surname of Griffith after the Surname of Darby, and use and bear the Arms of Griffith, in Addition to those of Darby, (pursuant to the Will of Catherine Griffith, Widow, his late Aunt, deceased,) such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's College.

Whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 19th of June last, several Persons, composing a Boat's Crew, belonging to His Majesty's Gun Vessel the Hecate, who had boarded and taken Possession of a Smuggling Lugger laden with Spirits, which had been run ashore at a Place called Mullions, in Mount's-Bay, on the Coast of Cornwall, were attacked by a large Party of Men carrying Muskets, who, advancing to a Cliff at a small Distance from the Lugger, began firing upon them, and continued such Firing for a considerable Time, until the said Persons were under the Necessity, for the Safety of their Lives, to quit the Lugger and take to their Boat; after which they were again fired upon by the said armed Men, and, in particular, by one William Richards, otherwise called Payow, (supposed to be a Part-Owner of the said Lugger or her Cargo,) who has since absconded;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Offenders, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of them, (other than the said Richards alias Payow) who shall discover his or their Accomplices therein, so that any of them may be apprehended and convicted of the malicious and atrocious Act abovementioned. PELHAM.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty do hereby offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons (except the said Richards alias Payow,) who shall apprehend, or cause to be apprehended any of the said Offenders, or give such Information to their Lordships' Solicitor Mr. Bicknell, of Norfolk-Street, London, or Messrs. George and Samuel John, of Penzance, as may be the Means of their Apprehension, to be paid on the Conviction of any such Offenders so apprehended, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy for the Time being.

N. B. The said Richards alias Payow, is about Fifty-two Years of Age, Five Feet Seven Inches high, stout made, dark Hair straight and short, dark Complexion, dark Grey full Eyes, with reddish Eyelashes and Eyebrows, his Beard also red, and remarkably thick and large, large Mouth, and Teeth discoloured, Voice sharp and shrill.

NEW STAMP DUTIES ON DEEDS, &c.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, July 3, 1801.

In pursuance of Directions received from the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That, in order to prevent any Inconvenience to those Persons in the different Parts of the Kingdom, who shall not have been able to supply themselves with Vellum, Parchment, and Paper stamped according to an Act of Parliament, to which the Royal Assent was given Yesterday, owing to the Period for its Commencement taking place so soon after the passing thereof, here is a Clause in the said Act, empowering the Commissioner to cause such Instruments, viz. any Indenture, Lease, or other Deed, charged with an additional Duty of Three Shillings by an Act of the Thirty-seventh of the King, Cap. 90. as may, through Necessity, have been executed by any, or all of the Parties, upon Stamps in Use previous to the Year 1801, to be stamped with the additional Duties of FIVE SHILLINGS granted by Two Acts of the last Session of Parliament, on Payment of the said Duties only, without any Penalty,
