Extra8 of a Letter from Sir Charles Morice Pole, Bart. Vice-Admiral of the Blue, Cc. Cc. to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated off Cadiz, the 24th of Septemter 1801.

NCLOSED I tranfmit to you a Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Newton Starck, of the Milbrook Schooner, stating his Capture of a Spanish Privateer-called the Baptista; and one from Captain Hollis, of the Thames Frigate, informing me of the Capture of the Sparrow Spanish Priva-teer by the Boats of the faid Ship in a spirited and gallant Manner, which I pray you to lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

His Majefly's Schooher Milbrook, off Cadiz, September 21, 1801.

I Beg Leave to inform you, that on the 15th In-ftant, being off Cape Montego in His Majefty's Schooner Milbrook, under my Command, to put Schooner Milbrook, under my Command, to put myfelf under your Orders, I perceived a finall Spa-nifh Privateer, which, after a long Chafe, I fuc-ceeded in fecuring: her Name is the Baptilta, mounting Eight Guns, and was laden with a valuable Cargo of English Prize Butter, with which she was on her Paflage from Vigo to Seville.

His Majefly's Ship Thames, September 21, 1801, Cape Saint Mary N. W. by N. SIR, Four Leagues.

I Have to inform you, that this Morning, at Day-light, His Majefty's Ship Thames being be-tween the Sand Hills of San Lucar and Condan Point, discovered an Enemy's Lugger in the N. W. which, after a Chafe of Twelve Hours, (it then be-coming calm when about Three Miles from the Ship,) was boarded in a very spirited Manner by the Boats of the Thames, under the Command of Lieutenants Hawker, Stewart, and Lucas. She is called the Sparrow, a Spanish Privateer mounting Two Four-Pounders, Two Brass Swivels and small Arms, and Thirty-one Men, out Fifty-four Days,

had taken a Gibraltar Privateer, and was on her Return.
