

to dispose our Elector to consent to the choosing a Coadjutor, which could he have done, he would then have employed his Interests in favour of his Brother the Bishop of *Strasburg*.

*Hamburg Aug. 30.* The Velt Marshal *Conningsmarke* is still here, and two days since came hither the Duke of *Holslein Gottorp*. It's supposed he will make no long stay.

*Amsterdam, Sept. 3.* The difference between the Provinces of *Holland* and *Zealand* having gone so far, as that the latter had appointed one or two Men of War to require of all Vessels coming from *Holland*, that passed within their Jurisdiction, a certain Toll, which gave a great disturbance to Trade, the Prince of *Orange*, who as their Stadtholder is labouring to compose this matter, has already, as we are informed, prevailed with the States of *Zealand* to withdraw those Men of War, and to send their Deputies to the *Hague*, in order to the accommodating the said differences. The Prince, as we are told, is going to *Zell* to hunt: some report that it's probable he will see the Elector of *Brandenburg*, or at least the Electoral Prince, his Son, before he return. The States-General have sent a Deputation to the States of *Gronningen*, to press them to satisfy their part of the subsidies which they are still owing to the Princes of *Lunenburg*.

*Hague, Sept. 3.* To-morrow being the day appointed for the meeting of the States of *Holland*, several of the Members of that Assembly are already come hither, and the Pensioner *Fagel* has been in Town since last Saturday to prepare matters for them. Their chief business will be to endeavour to compose the difference which is at present between this province and that of *Zealand*, and to inform themselves how far the late Tax of the 200th penny has answered the intention in raising it, that they may thereupon take their measures accordingly. The Prince of *Orange* is not expected here till Friday next, and designs within few days after to make a step to the Duke of *Zell's* Court, where great preparations are making to receive his Highness, and particularly to entertain him with Hunting, which is said to be the chief occasion of his Journey. The Swedish Envoy Extraordinary, Monsieur *Guldenshop*, is preparing to appear publicly, his Equipage being almost in a readiness. From *Ratisbonne* they write, That some of the Princes of the Empire who have suffered the most by the late proceedings of the French, did by their Deputies at the Dyet very earnestly press the States to take some vigorous resolution, such as may be able to remove those heavy pressures they lay upon, which though the Dyet is sufficiently sensible of, yet it seems they do not think this a proper conjuncture to shew their resentment in, and have therefore resolved to endeavour by amicable means to induce the French King to give satisfaction to the Princes injured. Mr. *Sidney* returned from *Dieren* the last night.

*Brussels, Sept. 3.* The Heer *Dyckvelt*, who in his late return from *France*, where he was Ambassador from the States-General of the *United Provinces*, was ordered to stop here, is gone with the Duke de *Villa Hermosa* into *Flanders*; part of his Business is to solicit the Payment of the moneys which the Spaniards are owing to the Prince of *Orange*, to whom they were obliged to pay 40000 Guilders a Month while he was in the Field with the Army,

for the defraying several necessary Expences. The Duke de *Villa Hermosa* will return hither in time the next week. We have Letters from *Spain* by the way of *France* which say a thing of the departure of our new Governour the Prince of *Lima* from *Madrid*.

*Paris, Sept. 7.* We are now expecting to hear what the Kings final resolution is in the affair concerning the Title of *Burgundy*; for the last Term which His Majesty granted the Spaniards at the instance of the States-General of the *United Provinces*, will now quickly expire; and in the mean time the French Commissioners at *Courtray* have cas'd to have any Conferences with those of *Spain*. The 4th Instant the Dutch Ambassador, the Heer *Van Varenberg* had his first Audience of the King. And the next day the Sieur *Heug*, Ambassador from *Denmark*, had a private Audience of his Majesty.

*Plymouth, Aug. 27.* Yesterday morning came in here the *Oxford* Frigate Captain *Mason* Commander, and Sailed again in the Evening to Cruise.

*Windsoer, Aug. 31.* This day in the Afternoon a Chapter being Summoned in the usual Form, and in the usual place, of the Knights Companions of the most Noble Order of the Garter, the Sovereign being present, there were Elected into the Vacancies of that Order his Grace the Duke of *Grafton*, who is now at Sea, and the Right Honourable the Earl of *Salisbury*; but the Inveiture was not proceeded upon, by reason of both their absence. After that, His Majesty went in his Mantle only into the Royal Chappel, and there, attended by the Knights Companion's likewise in their Mantles, made the usual Offerings during the Service of the Church appropriated to that Ceremony.
