THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fourth Day of June last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this instant December : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this inftant December, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Ganpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled " An Act to empower His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, " and to enforce the Law for empowering. His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo " to empower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying " Coaftwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort " of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Right Ho-

to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Illands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majelty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Conft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitz do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commillioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the taid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain. Copy of a Letter from Rear Admiral Sir John Bor-lafe Warren, Bart. and K. B. to Evan Nepean, Efg; dated at Port Mabon, 24th October 1801. SIR,

Have enclosed to you the Copy of a Letter relative to the Transactions that have taken place at Porto Ferrajo, which I request you will be pleased [Notice to the concerned, that Information has been :

to lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

I have the Honor to remain, &c. &c. &c. JOHN BORLASE WARREN.

SIR, Porto Ferrajo, October 11, 1801. IN my Letter of Yesterday I had the Honor to report to you, that the Enemy had shewn lately fome Difposition to advance and take Ground nearer our Works, and this Morning I found they had thrown up an Intrenchment of Earth and Gabions upon a Peninfula or Tongue of Land within Two Hundred Yards of our Works.

I immediately determined to defiroy the Work and diflodge them before they could have Time to ftrengthen or bring any Guns upon it : I appointed De Bercy's Corps for this Service with a Party of Peafants to deftroy the Work, and the Maltele Corps, under Major Weir, to fupport and cover them; about Eleven o'Clock they croffed the Ditch, drove the Enemy from the Ground, and deftroyed the Work.

The Enemy made Two or Three Attempts to advance in Force, but were completely kept in Check by our Grape-Shot from the Batteries, which were admirably well ferved; their Batteries kept up a very heavy Fire of Round and Grape-Shot, which did us very little Harm. The Bufinel's being completed, the Troops returned into the Works, having fuffered incounderably in Numbers; though we have to lament One Officer killed and Three wounded.

I was a good deal inclined to have kept Poffeffion of the Ground, but upon Confideration of the Weaknefs of our Force, 1 thought it fcarcely ten-able fo clofe to the Enemy's Works; more elpecially as we were advifed this Morning of their hav-ing got a Reinforcement of Two Hundred Men from Piombino, Two or Three Nights ago. I flatter myfelf, however, they are equally convinced of their Inability to keep a Poft fo near us. The Enemy admit between Sixty and Seventy

killed and wounded, and Three Officers ; and from what we could fee ourfelves, I am perfuaded they are within the Mark in this Calculation.
